EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE REPORTS:

VICE CHAIRS (Jenny Wilson & Derek Harwood):

The main feature in the period has been out ongoing Talks programme. See Catherine's report below. The Peer Support Groups have all held their regular meetings covering a range of interesting topics.

TREASURER (Jim Jenkins)

Current Funds: £7,881. This is down £922 on the year to date mainly due to the cost of the Networking Meeting (for Chairs) held at Bridwell in November last year.

The above excludes receipts so far for the 2022 Summer School. As at 11 April receipts stand at £6,123 with a further £507 in unpaid bookings. We are therefore just over 50% towards our target bookings to break even.

John Bent has very kindly funded the full cost of our Zoom licence for the year from the Regional budget so this is cost-neutral for us.

COMMUNICATIONS (Vivek Nanda)

The Communications Team evaluated and rejected Beacon for Networks. The reason for this was the limited functionality in Beacon for Networks compared to the tools already in use by the Communications Team, which are Mailchimp for emails and Wufoo for events. Using these tools, 26 emails were sent to 2396 recipients with roles on local u3as or at the regional level and 10 emails were sent to 4609 recipients who are Members of u3as in London for Regional talks and events since the last Delegates meeting.

TALKS & SUMMER SCHOOL COORDINATOR (Catherine Ware)

London Region Online Talks programme:

Eight fortnightly online talks were hosted in the Winter series from 10th Jan to 4th Apr 1922.

A total of 1,363 members attended these talks. The average attendance rate was 74% -- highest in January (93%) and decreasing in March (62%). Attendance dropped last summer when the weather improved and Covid restrictions were lifted making it easier to meet in person. Anticipating a similar pattern this summer, the Events Team will focus on the Summer School, and online talks will resume in October. A number of attendees, and speakers, have said that they are unable/disinclined to return to in-person u3a activities even with their local u3as, and have been advised to log onto the u3a national website and Trust u3a to take advantage their many online activities.

London Region Summer School: Tuesday 26th and Wednesday 27th July:

The event was publicised in February TAM, and programmes were sent to all London u3as plus individual attendees of last year's Summer School and Online Talks programme. Further information and application forms are available on Events page of LRU3A website. The ticket price was maintained at a pre-pandemic level of £39, and our target revenue is £11,550, which if achieved, would yield a modest surplus of just £47. Bookings were launched on the evening of 7th April and there was an immediate rush of bookings and over £6,000 was paid by 12th April. All 8 walks were fully booked within 3 days. About 20% applicants so far are from outside London – as far away as Sidmouth, Lancaster, Cirencester and Monmouth. About 40% of applicants so far have not attended a London Summer School before.

REGIONAL TRUSTEE (John Bent)

Work ongoing re re-shaping Trust u3a. This is to be incorporated to 'Learning' by October. More action starting to happen on the Age Friendly London initiative.

GROUP COORDINATORS PEER SUPPORT GROUP (Liz Day)

It is hoped that a new Peer Support group on Diversity and Inclusion might be organised to follow up ideas from last Group Coordinators Network meeting in December 2021.

The Agenda of our last grp Coord meeting on 28.03.22 was aimed to introduce LR Group Coordinators to staff at the u3a Office who are responsible for developing Learning services in the u3a, including presentations about Subject Advisers, the online Trust u3a and the Learning Hub. This involved a lot of information about projects and activities available on the website.

PUBLIC RELATIONS PEER SUPPORT GROUP (Rodney Fox)

Our February workshop focussed on producing effective Press Releases, its produced many tips on how to get your u3a story into local media.

The next workshop on May 9th will examine why u3as need to recruit new younger members if they wish to survive into the 2030s. It will also look at ways to make our u3as more attractive to younger potential members yet at the same time maintaining the u3a ethos; how we can locate and identify these new members; and some alternatives to u3a available to them.

Issue 9 of our London Region PR Mailings has just been issued to London u3as. An article prepared for a local Residents Association get distributed in their Newsletter to thousands of homes. This edition also follows on earlier coverage of Hillingdon u3a working with a Social Prescribing Link Worker in placing posters /brochures in 11 local surgeries with coverage and links to The Social Prescribing Academy, which provides lots of useful materials.

Bookmarks for the 40th Anniversary, business cards for people members meet and postcards to give to potential new members are two of a number of ideas included in recent editions.

WEBMASTERS PEER SUPPORT GROUP (Derek Harwood)

Last meeting covered various topics, update re SiteBuilder replacement, Live transcript with PowerPoint, discussion on future Shared Practice Guides (on Mailchimp, Online forms, Bank card readers) and Let's Talk Tech (LTT) initiative – more sharing of IT support.
