DISCUSSIONS

Sitebuilder (SB) Replacement/ SiteWorks (SW): thanks were again offered to Palmers Green & Southgate u3a for their (1st December) presentation on their experience of the migration process from SB to SW. Copy of their presentation is on the LRU3A Sharing webpage. There had now also been a presentation by Nick Talbott (one of the Leads on SW) at the Lets Talk Tech forum. This is now also on the LRU3A Sharing webpage. DH took the meeting through those slides. Shows the difference between the 'migration' route and the 'starter' route. Shows progress to date – the growing number of u3as ow live on SW. The schedule issued before gives a priority (based on when u3as/ networks registered for wanting to migrate). It doesn't give a definite date on when each site migration will happen. But on discussions it seemed if anything the SW volunteer team were ahead of this schedule – but caution was expressed as, as more migrate, and some of the large u3as, then might take longer. The time also dependent on the u3as - how quick they were in reviewing and accepting the SW Terms & Conditions. Many u3as are now being issued the Ts & Cs (through Beacon to registered Chairs & Webmasters) to allow a stock of u3as with accepted Ts & Cs to be then ready for migration. Therefore: make sure you are on the list, you are registered for migration; & make sure you turnaround the Ts & Cs quickly. Overall those that have migrated are happy – with the proceed, support, & result. Many then take time after migration to fix the add error (eg broken links) but also then the realisation they have more work to do in updating content. A list of the u3as live on SW has been added to Nick's slides. Nick used these to show that, while there is a base SW 'instance' there is still a lot of flexibility in layout and even functions. Some u3as are adding their own plug-ins (although these are then not supported by the SW Team). Priority is being to those electing the migration route. Support for the starter route will only be available after the 700 SB sites are migrated.

2. **Open Discussion:** a few general points were raised:

MC mentioned issues re 'DMRAC'. Google are trying to tighten up on security and may ask you/ Google account holders to add some information to your account (for verification). Also seems Mailchimp are trying to combat mass scammers (change to 'DNS Records') and are creating a (Mailchimp) alias email address for use with Audiences. This can mean (for u3as



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using Mailchimp) that your Newsletters are going into members scam/junk folders. Members need to know this to then check their junk folder and mark this relevant email as 'Not Junk' or add the alias to their Contacts list. Then they've receive future Mailchimp emails normally.

MC highlighted that (for those not using the free SW hosting service) that 'Krystal' offer free website hosting for charities.

DH highlight that although Zoom had tightened up on their security, there was a Network Link meeting where they were 'bombed'. 'Woodpecker' joined the meeting briefly, posted some chats, then left. Watch who you admit to your meetings.
