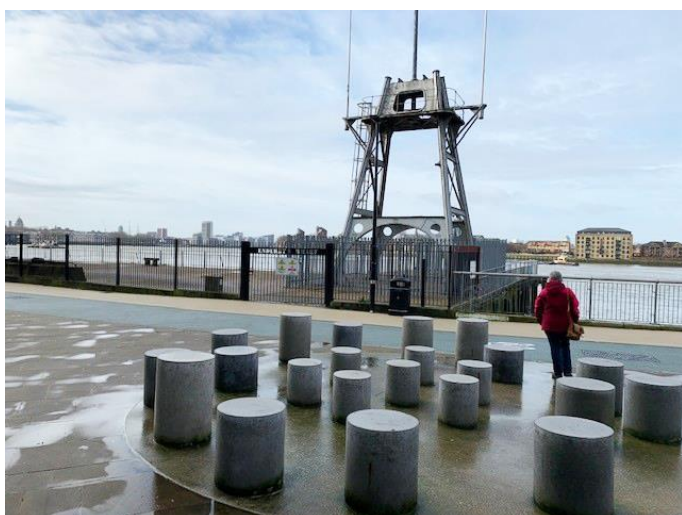

### Tuesday June 29<sup>th</sup> Joyden's Wood with Stuart Weir

We will meet at Kelsey Farm Shop (Woollett Hall Farm, Water Ln, Sidcup DA14 5ET) just off the North Cray Road. The stroll is just under four miles in total and takes approximately two hours. Unfortunately, the farm shop isn't well served by public transport so arriving by car is advised. You might need to talk to other members of the group to arrange lifts please do this directly rather than through Stuart or Roger. There is a café and loos at the farm shop (Covid willing) and the opportunity to buy fresh fruit & veg.

There are a range of subjects to photograph from horses to a sculpture of a wartime Hurricane aircraft, a 1500 year old dyke to keep the Roman soldiers from London apart from the Anglo Saxon soldiers from Kent and not least, trees – lots of them. There are hills but we will take a leisurely pace and the paths are well defined so the only soldiers we will see are two wooden ones at the back of the local scout hut.
