

Online Learning Events from u3a National Office

Online Learning Events from u3a National Office

Our National Office offers a number of workshops, webinars and interactive sessions, delivered by members for members, which are free to join. These are in high demand and spaces are limited, particularly for those with an interactive element.

In February, events include: David Hockney and the Theatre – Friday, February 23 at 2pm. Through sound and video, art historian, Peter Webb brings Hockney's theatre to life. Peter Webb has degrees from Cambridge and London Universities and a Doctorate from the University of East Anglia. After a lectureship at Coventry College of Art, he started teaching the first ever degree course in England on the subject of The Erotic Arts at Hornsey College of Art in London in 1970. After Hornsey, he taught at Middlesex University in London, and retired as Reader in the History of 20th Century Art in 1996; Science Network Event – Tuesday 27 February at 9.30am. Dr Jonathan Kennedy will discuss his book, Pathogenesis: How Germs Made History. Humans are generally seen as the main actors in the history of our species. Outbreaks of infectious diseases have destroyed millions of lives and decimated civilizations, but the devastation created opportunities for new societies and ideas to emerge and thrive. Pathogenesis was a Radio 4 book of the week and a Sunday Times, Waterstones and Amazon science book of the year;

Secrets of the Human Brain: Sleep and Dreams – Thursday 29 February at 2pm. Talk2: Awake, Asleep and Dreams (Was I Dreaming?) This talk explains how our brains make us wake, sleep and dream. It explains how different parts of the brain are responsible for keeping us awake and making us go to sleep. The talk continues to explain how we have different kinds of sleep and why we dream. Bob also asks the audience to talk about their own dreams and the meaning of dreams is discussed.

Asda £1 Deal

Asda is doing "Soup and a Roll plus unlimited tea or coffee" for anyone 60 or over for just £1 per person in their cafes until Feb 28th.

Support and advice for people in Derbyshire affected by Storm Babet at drop-in events around the county.

Derbyshire County Council will hold a series of public drop-in sessions around the county for local communities affected by flooding. Residents and businesses will be able to talk to local agencies about their experience, get advice and share their views as well as finding out what is being done to help the community recover.

Representatives from the Environment Agency, district and borough councils, Severn Trent Water and Derbyshire County Council will be on hand to talk to local people. The one for communities in Breaston, Long Eaton, Sandiacre and surrounding areas will be held in Sawley on Friday 16th February at Sawley Memorial Hall, Draycott Road, NG10 3FR from 2pm to 7pm.

While the events have been organised with local communities in mind, they are open to any members of the public.

Derbyshire Time Swap

Time Swapping (or Time Banking) is a fantastic initiative which allows members of the community to 'swap' their time to help somebody else. This support can range from assistance with gardening, to teaching I.T skills, or giving cookery lessons - the sky is the limit!

In return for this, a member of the community earns back time which they can spend doing something they want to – like learning a new skill or receiving help from another member. Members can even donate time they have accrued to other members if they wish. Time is the only currency used. Erewash Borough Council Garden Waste Collection Fee Prices

How much will the garden waste service cost from April 2024 to March 2025?

The annual charge depends on when and how you sign up. Here are the charges:

Early Bird Online - sign up online between 29 January to 31 March 2024 - £20 first bin, additional bins £10 per bin.

By Telephone - £32 first bin, additional bins £16 per bin.

Online – sign up online after 31 March 2024 – £32 first bin, additional bins £16 per bin. In Person – £37 first bin, additional bins £18.50 per bin.

When and how can I sign up?

You can sign up from Monday 29 January, using the following ways:

- Online through My Erewash, find out how to set up an account.
- Calling our Customer Services Team on 0115 9072244
- Visiting Ilkeston or Long Eaton Town Halls (please check opening times before travel).
