

















Photography Group

Online Learning Events from u3a National Office

Our National Office offers a number of workshops, webinars and interactive sessions, delivered by members for members, which are free to join. These are in high demand and spaces are limited, particularly for those with an interactive element. In April, events include:

A Remarkable Woman: The Arts and Crafts Designs of May Morris – Thursday, 11th April at 2pm. Overshadowed for many years by her more famous father, May Morris is now beginning to gain the recognition she deserves as being an incredibly talented craftswoman in her own right. Teacher, lecturer, editor, jeweller and designer, May was accomplished in a wide range of crafts, but it is her work as an embroiderer that is considered to be her greatest achievement. May's knowledge of needlework, her talent for designing and her brilliance with the needle led to raising the status of embroidery to fine art. This talk will cover May's life and work, with a focus on her beautiful designs and completed embroideries, demonstrating why May should be regarded as one of the most significant artists of the Arts and Crafts Movement.

From Despair to Delight: the Sonnets of Gerard Manley Hopkins – Thursday, 18th April at 2pm. Hopkins was one of the most original poets writing in English during the 19th century. Throughout his life he experienced a range of intense emotions, from utter misery to great joy. And he has an astonishing ability to express his emotions in his poetry. In this talk, Christopher Dowrick discusses six of Hopkins' sonnets, taking a healing journey from despair, through detachment and determination, to comfort of self and comfort of others, and finally to delight.

Secrets of the Human Brain: Talk Four: The Blood - Brain Barrier - Wednesday, 24th April at 2pm. This talk explains there is a major barrier between our circulating blood and brain. This barrier stops many substances in the blood crossing into the brain which has advantages and disadvantages! About the Speaker: Dr Bob Pullen is a retired University Lecturer who has spent many years giving lectures on the brain to Medical, Pharmacy and Biology students. He has also undertaken brain research in England and America. He is not a Medical Doctor but has a Doctoral Degree in Neuroscience from Oxford University. He has learned many interesting facts about the human brain which he includes in this series of talks.

The British Heart Foundation has an app suitable for a smartphone. It's called RevivR and is well worth trying.


Building Community Connections
