A Happy New Year!

I hope you all enjoyed the Christmas/New Year break and are raring to go for 2024.

My first request is for help! Our Treasurer plans to retire at the AGM in April, and we need someone to take over. This work takes an average of just 2 hours a week, though there are busier periods. We use the national u3a online system called Beacon to manage our money, and we can provide support to someone new. Beacon financial management is based on a secure, simple transaction approach. Every transaction can be assigned to individuals, groups and categories, and the system provides tools for reconciliation with bank accounts and regular reporting, including Gift Aid declarations and claims. Sociologist Ruha Benjamin is here with a more radical vision of the future — one where humanity isn't saved or slayed by technology, but rather uses it to uplift ordinary people and make things like health care and housing for all a reality.
