# **Aviation Network Meeting: Milestones in Aviation**

Tuesday 4<sup>th</sup> April. 10,00 a.m.

The u3a Aviation Network is organised by <u>Don Mobley of Stowmarket u3a</u> and Barbara Cordina of Lea Valley u3a. Meetings are held on the first Tuesday of every month at 10.00 a.m.

The first 'Round the World' flight was launched 100 years ago to the week this presentation will be given. On 6 April 1924, eight U.S. Army Air Service pilots and mechanics embarked on an audacious mission to circumnavigate the globe by air.

This comprehensive and enlightening presentation traces the remarkable journey of human flight from its earliest dreams and theoretical concepts to the incredible advancements of the modern era. Beginning with the pioneering work of the Wright brothers, who achieved the first sustained, controlled flight in 1903, we explore the subsequent innovations that propelled aviation forward.
