u3a - Online Learning Events

Chinese Wand Exercises for Mobility, Fitness and Fun

Friday 12th January and Friday 19th January at 10.00 a.m.

Sit or stand to do Ancient Chinese exercises for fitness, mobility, strength, balance using a lightweight cane and incremental movements

You only have to sign up once, to attend both sessions.

Chinese Wand Exercises - a system of 17 simple movements with graduated stages which are suitable and effective for everyone.

The movements can be performed standing or sitting and are done slowly with attention on the gradual build-up of mobility and stamina. The low impact and progressive nature of this exercise system is ideal for injury prevention and rehabilitation as well as development and maintenance of fitness and health. People recovering from injury, stroke, surgery or periods of inactivity and ill-health can perform the basic movements whilst the more advanced positions of each stage are beneficial for people who want to maintain or improve core strength and supplement other fitness regimes or sporting activities. The exercises are helpful for improving the mobility and strength of spinal and core muscles as they done in graduated stages, each time starting at the same place and progressing according to ability.

You will need a lightweight cane, pole or stick approximately 48 inches (122cm) long and 3/4in (2cm) diameter. Garden canes are good or a piece of dowelling but you can use a walking stick or pole, a broom handle or anything else that you might have that is about the right length (shorter is better than longer). A scarf also does the job (and gets you working harder!!) If you intend to sit for some or all of the exercises, have a chair without arms. If this isn't possible then have a much shorter stick.

The story of Major Leonard Bernemy (1920 – 2016)

Friday 26th January 2.00 p.m.

Born to Jewish parents in London in 1920, Leonard Berney joined the army immediately after school and was appointed an officer aged 18. Several years later he was one of the first of the Allied troops through the gates of the disease-ridden, overcrowded Bergen-Belsen Concentration Camp where he came face-to-face with its many horrors. He remained there for 14 weeks, helping save as many lives as possible, and becoming the Commander of the Belsen Displaced Persons Camp. After the war, Leonard became a successful businessman running the UK's largest clothing factory and later, his own haute couture dress company.

The talk, given by Leonard's son John Wood, includes a detailed personal account of the liberation of the camp with video testimony by both Leonard and Belsen survivors, as well as many historical and personal photographs

Initially, Leonard never spoke about Belsen but on the 30th anniversary of the liberation he told John the whole story. On discovering, some years later, the existence of Holocaust denial he was outraged and started to speak publicly about his Belsen experience.
