WALKING GROUP

Kirkham Christmas Walk

All's quiet at the Kingfisher Pub at 9:30am on this cold bright Friday morning, a door cracks open at the kitchen entrance to receive a Starbucks delivery, a short time later a large group of familiar faces are gathered at the main entrance, mostly peeking out from under a variety of colourful headwear, lunches preordered, now all gathered quietly listening to our leader Susan as she gives us a brief introduction to the history of Kirkham, mentioning some chap called Birley more than once and his flax/sail-cloth making business which was back at a time when Kirkham was the biggest town on the Fylde plain.





The hats move on to Kirkham Grammar school, which has a long history and has produced a variety of well-known personalities such as Clive Tyldesley (who's he? I hear you ask) and quite a few rugby players since its quoted inception of 1549. Sadly, none of the original building remains. Further up the road a glass case by the side of the road minding its own business contains 'The Last Loom', looking like it could do with a bit of TLC (don't we all) and today it is performing for 15 coloured tops.

After a brief stop off at the Memorial Park, we arrive at St Michael's church where we are honoured to be allowed to view the small upstairs museum, and the copy of the Roman Brass shield Boss which was discovered in Kirkham, thought to be from late 1st /early 2nd century, and is in excellent condition for its age, a bit like us really. The actual Boss is supposed to be in the British Museum, but it could equally be on eBay! On the return leg now and we pause at the main intersection of Poulton St, Preston St, Freckleton St and Church St and silently congratulate those responsible for being so sensible with the road names. This is the location

of 'A Lancashire Village, 1935' by LS Lowry. We imagine removing our hats and we are the stick figures acting up in this work of art.

Our next stop is Kirkham URC where we learn about the town shop front restoration project and the adjacent giant multi-coloured mural, showcasing many of the main elements of the history of the town. Past the Queen Victoria Jubilee Memorial and onto the final stretch of the walk now and we cotton tops are stretched out among the trees as Susan lengthens her pace. We come to the biscuit factory and a free Rocky bar is our reward for getting this far. Passing by the factory and a strong and delightful aroma of cake mixture fills the air around us, making us hungry for our lunch. Hats off to the Chef for some quality food, the Starbucks did its job, the fish pie is popular, only 2 bones in mine and Ken is served first – it must be Christmas!

BEACON FOR u3a MEMBERS

As you may be aware, Lytham St Annes u3a uses an online data management system called Beacon to manage our members, groups and finances. When you joined the u3a, you provided us with some basic information about yourself, and we store that information on Beacon, but did you know that there is a member's portal where you can view this information and change it?

To sign on to the Beacon members portal, first navigate to the Lytham St Annes u3a website (from Google, search for 'Lytham St Annes u3a' or even simply 'lsa u3a', then select one of the results, for example 'Lytham St Annes u3a: Groups') and from this web page, click on the Members tab. (This is the word Members in blue lettering on a yellow background at the top of the screen). You should now be on the Members page.

Alternatively, go there directly - https://u3asites.org.uk/lytham-st-annes/page/127530

From here, you can go to the Portal sign on screen by clicking on the link 'Members Portal'.

If this is your first time, you have to register for an account, so click on the blue text 'Register for a membership account'. To register you will need your membership number, and your name and postcode and email address. Follow the instructions and you should end up with an account which is your email address and a password. Now you can return to the portal sign in screen and sign in to Beacon.

Once signed in, you should see 5 options.

- Renew your Membership ignore this option, as we don't do on-line renewals yet.
- Lytham St Annes u3a Groups this option allows you to see a list of all of our active groups. You will be able to see details of each group, for example when and where they meet and a brief synopsis of the group. In some cases, you can click on 'join group' if you wish to join the group.
- Calendar of Meetings and Events this option lists all scheduled group and general meetings in date order. Note that the group meetings will only be here if the Group leader has added them.
- Update your Personal Details This option allows you to view and update
 the information we have about you. You can also add a photo of yourself or
 change your password. If you add a photo, then this will appear on your
 membership card next time it is issued. For best results, crop the photo to
 a square before uploading it. Please take the time to add emergency
 contact details. This information could be useful to one of your Group
 Leaders or a Committee member in the event of an emergency.
- Email Replacement Membership Card This option allows you to get a
 copy of your membership card by email in case you have lost the original.
 And if you have added a photo, then that will be decorating your card in the
 top right hand corner. How good is that!

So, now you know a bit more about what Beacon can do for you. Why not have a go when you have a bit of free time.
