#### Wine Appreciation Group One: Mike Allen

On a sunny afternoon in August 2023, an intrepid group of ten u3a wine buffs set out from Mansfield to discover the outer reaches of the wine world. Not Italy, France or Chile, let alone India or China, but ... Derbyshire. In the 'remote' village of Wessington (On the A615 to Matlock), down Back Lane lies the home of Amber Valley Wines.

In a sloping field overlooking the Amber River to the east lay six rows of vines, a shed called a shop, a car park and an apple orchard in which chairs were laid out surrounding an open pavilion. The owner, an enthusiastic English eccentric, regaled us with the history of the vineyard.

A Damascene moment after his university degree led him to travel the world looking at and working in vineyards. Back home in Derbyshire, he realized that it might be possible to create wine on family lands. Starting with only a little knowledge, he, with his family and a partner, planted vines in the April snow of 2012 and waited for the first harvest. A full-time job was necessary as no fortune could be made from a few vines.

But the grapes grew and the wine was made from about 2018 onwards. The vineyard is organic, as the owner is a 'regenerative' farmer, refusing to use chemicals, not even weeding under the vines, as this would disturb the biomes in the soil. None of this is unusual nowadays, but it was when he first started.

This was all gathered, along with much other interesting information on viticulture in England, as we walked along the rows of Solaris grapes, with Bacchus and other varietals. English wines have achieved international fame, but these are champagnetype wines, from the chalk hills of southern England. Derbyshire vines, on different ground, with less sun, more frost and rain are another matter.

Only some white grapes do well, and red wines are almost impossible to make as their grapes need harsh sun.

The success of the vintage lies in the wine. So how do the white wines of Amber Valley compare? There was no fizzy wine – 'sold out' till the new batch arrives at Christmas, but there were four wines to taste - two white, one rosé and an 'amber' (obviously!) blend of grapes. The Margot blend was pleasant, light with a decent after taste and length, with a fruity 'nose'; the Millstone was harsher, more acidic and less pleasant.

I found the rosé quite acidic again – pleasant enough for a summer evening, but not more than a couple of glasses, while the amber wine (an orange colour created with blending some red grapes in) was rather sharp and heavy.

So far, so good. Acceptable wine that could be interesting. The main problem with English wine is the price and these ran from £12 to £20 a bottle. With the recent duty increase (let alone the Brexit increase), they have to compete against some good wines from elsewhere. Unfortunately, I don't think they do, yet. Given time, and greater economy of scale, they may do, but not yet.

However, that does not stop us admiring the guts of an Englishman making wine in Derbyshire, nor prevent us from enjoying an afternoon's wine tasting in the sun under the cider apple trees (£15 per person) and learning about viticulture. So do check the website – there are Farmers and Artisans Markets on the land as well. And enjoy a glass of the Margot if you can...



# **LEARN**

In our final post to mark #NottsDay we look at another notable person from Mansfield, the architect Watson Fothergill, whose distinctive buildings have left an indelible footprint on the county. He's probably associated more with Nottingham but it was in Mansfield where some of his earliest designed buildings can be found.

Born Fothergill Watson in Mansfield, in 1841, he was the son of a wealthy Nottingham Lace merchant, Robert Watson and Mary Ann Fothergill. He changed his name to Watson Fothergill later in life to continue his maternal family name. In 1867, at St John's Church, Mansfield, he married Anne Hage, whose father, Samuel Hage, was a founding partner of Mansfield Brewery.


Watson Fothergill's influences were mainly from the Gothic Revival and Old English vernacular architecture styles. His easily recognisable style includes the use of contrasting bands of red and blue brick, timber eaves and balconies, elaborate turrets and stone carvings, strongly influenced by his interest in medieval history.

He designed over 100 buildings in Nottingham including offices, banks, warehouses, churches and houses. Among the buildings he designed in Mansfield are an 1874 rebuilding of the Mansfield branch of the Nottingham and Notts Bank in Church Street (later incorporated into The Swan pub) which features Fothergill's signature style of twin gables at the front.

There is also the King's Arms, in Ratcliffe Gate/Newgate Lane, (1875), houses in St John's Street, and the Cattle Market building, in Nottingham Road, Mansfield (1876). It is now the Ciao Bella restaurant. Find out more about his Mansfield buildings


