Nacreous clouds are also known as mother-of-pearl clouds. Unlike their low altitude counterparts, they appear in the stratosphere, soaring at heights of 9 to 16 miles above the Earth's surface and are most commonly observed within two hours after sunset or before dawn, when they remain illuminated by the sun's rays.



But here's a thought. If the best chess player in the world is now a computer using AI, will the best artist, musician, poet, novelist in the future also be a computer using AI?


I shall be discussing this question in two talks:

- The battle of Waterloo Nigel Smith.


