EAST SUSSEX WILDLIFE RESCUE AND AMBULANCE SERVICE

TREVOR WEEKS M.B.E. spoke to us in March about the invaluable work of WRAS - East Sussex Wildlife Rescue & Ambulance Service which is a front line rescue service to help people who find sick, injured and orphaned wildlife across East Sussex. Every year WRAS receives between 2-3,000 calls for help. On site WRAS's rescuers provide vital first aid to casualties, starting the care right at the beginning at the rescue location.

In 2012 Trevor was named in the Queen's Birthday Honours List, receiving the MBE, later that year he received the BBC Sussex & Surrey Community Heroes Award for Animal Welfare, and in 2013 the charity won the Local Animal Charity of the Year.

In December 2021 WRAS staff and volunteers were given a Wealden Heroes Award by local MP Nus Ghani for all their hard work throughout the Covid pandemic which saw WRAS deal with over 5100 casualties in 2020.
