

The paper £10 note featuring Charles Darwin will soon become extinct. The last day to use them is March 1st 2018. Most businesses are not accepting them already. After that date the old notes will no longer be legal tender and you should be using the new polymer ones.

Some banks may accept/exchange the old ones but they do not have to; your alternative is to fill in a form and send the notes to the Bank of England, London.

So, check your pockets and drawers and make sure you spend every one of the Darwin notes before March 1st.
