Gardening Group - RHS Bridgewater

On Wednesday 8th September 24 of the MBM U3A members went to the new RHS Bridgewater Gardens. The trip was organised by the Gardening Group originally for 2019, 2020 and finally 2021. Empty coach places allowed other U3A members to go on the trip.

> We arrived by 10.20 after an easy short journey. The weather was beautiful, too hot for some people.

The entrance is impressive with large wooden beams and plenty of glass. Passing through the entrance we came out into the Welcome Garden where there were clipped Beech trees, Yew Domes, long Grasses and herbaceous perennials.

From there we walked into the 'Walled Garden' which is divided by good paths into separate gardens.The Kitchen Garden had ripe pumpkins, leeks, and onions whilst the Fruit garden had raspberries, blueberries, apples and

pears. Colour was dramatic in the Jewel, Bee and Butterfly gardens with vivid reds, oranges, yellows and purple from the Rudbeckia, Asters, Lobelia, Helianthus and Salvia, The grasses, of which there were many varieties, were over 5ft tall, some were even over 6ft. Sedums, Nerines and Kniphofia showed late Autumn colour.

Towards the Ellesmere Lake, now restored was the foundation of the Japanese Garden with a typical Red Arched Bridge over a stream where some planting had been done including Mecanopsis. Help in designing had been given by the Manchester Japanese people.

In the woodlands plenty of seats and a place to buy drinks and snacks could be found. This was enjoyed by those who had taken picnics. Those who chose to buy lunch could sit in the shade and watch birds on the Moon Bridge water.

A successful day was had by all and many bought plants to take home. Amongst the group it was decided that a visit next year in a different month would be a good idea.

Finnish Language & Culture




