## Outings Group

Only a select few joined the February outing to the Lowry Gallery and Imperial War Museum but had an enjoyable private tour of Lowry paintings and a guide told us some personal backstory of his life that made it into one of his paintings

On the contrary for the March outing, fifty members signed up to visit,

Castlefield Viaduct (Garden in the Sky) 22nd March. Fortunately this is the maximum number for a group booking !! May I suggest to travel on train and then take tram travelling on the Eccles line but get off at Castlefield/Deansgate stop. Turn left after you disembark the tram. You will see a sign at ground level saying Castlefield viaduct this way. You will need to walk across three tram lines at this point. Please take care and cross safely. Turn left again and walk towards car park and you will see a sign for it as Castlefield Viaduct in the distance. It will take you within 5 to 10 minutes walk from the tram station.

A trip to Liverpool World Museum is now on Tuesday the 18th of April (changed from Monday the 17th as the museum is closed on Mondays). So far only 5 members signed up for this tour. It won't be financially viable to hire a coach for so few numbers (minimum number of 35 needed), so we will travel by train (rail ticket cost £17:50 with senior rail card it will only be £11:35). The group booking at the museum is at 12 noon. The entry to the museum is free.

For May outings, we are booked to visit

Macclesfield silk museum on Friday the 19th of May. Unfortunately the paradise mill will be closed for refurbishment although the exact date in May hasn't been finalised. The guided tours of the Silk Museum which looks at the machine gallery including braiding and tassel-making historical machinery, looks at the industrial and social history of the silk industry and those who worked here, and Egyptology collection which stems from Marianne Brocklehurst's explorations from the 19th century. The cost for the guided tour is £6 pp and refreshments (hot drinks and cake £4 pp). The travel arrangement for getting there and back is still being worked out bearing in mind the coach cost will depend on the numbers attending.

Apologies in advance for writing about 2023 Christmas but the Christmas at Chatsworth are normally finalised in February of the year !! We have been able to reserve a slot for this year which will be on Wednesday the 8th of November 2023 and the time for the house entry at 13:30. We have time to wander around Christmas market before and visit the light trail in the gardens afterwards (which is included in the price). The cost for this trip will be £51 (£34pp for house and garden plus £17 pp for the coach hire and driver's gratuitous). There are only limited numbers availability. So book early to avoid disappointment.

We are taking booking for all the above trips at March, April & May general meetings.

## Strolling Group

Our "Strolling Group" is for members who would like a gentle stroll rather than a longer walk We arrange strolls of about 2 miles followed by a cuppa. These take place on the first Tuesday mornings in the month commencing at 10.30am, unless otherwise stated.


The stroll is approximately 1½ miles. Return buses are 20 minutes past the hour. Strollers can decide whether they go straight home or stay for a drink.


