Do you live somewhere with limited access to for when you want it! public transport?

Book-a-Bus is sponsored by West Sussex County Council. Its aim is to provide transport to those who are isolated by providing transport from their village to a transport hub such as Midhurst. It's £2 a ride, free to bus pass holders (normal time limits). There are currently three "Book a Bus" services: North of Midhurst, Petworth and Pulborough - the 98 service, which also serves the King Edward's Estate. West of Midhurst & Chichester- the 96 service. East of Midhurst as far as Pulborough – the 99 service.
