Monthly Talks are usually held on the third Tuesday of the month at 2.30 in the Methodist Church Hall, North Street, Midhurst. We hope the following format will be possible again but please check before coming: Arrive by 2.15 for a cup of tea and a biscuit, buy tickets for events, watch our version of 'Pearl & Dean', browse the noticeboards for information on u3a groups and activities, socialise with other members, find out how to participate in true u3a style, share ideas for u3a activities and enjoy a talk from a visiting speaker. Coming on your own? Think you might not know anyone? Ask the "Meeters and Greeters" at the entrance and in the hall to introduce you to another member at the start of the meeting. The next six meetings:

16 November - For Valour: the story of the Victoria Cross: Jeremy Prescott. Jeremy served 27 years in the infantry, reaching the rank of Lieutenant Colonel with active service in Northern Ireland and Oman. He also served in Germany, Kenya, Zimbabwe, and Norway.

14 December - The Heritage of Gilbert & Sullivan : Bernard Lockett. Bernard is a life-long G&S enthusiast, a Trustee of the International G&S Festival, and of the Festival's National G&S Opera Company.

18 January - Masters of the Sea: maritime art from the 17th century to the present : James Taylor. James is a former curator of paintings, drawings, and prints at the National Maritime Museum.

15 February - To Eritrea and Ethiopia: retracing a Victorian Expedition : John Pilkington. In 1868 Queen Victoria's government mounted an extraordinary bid to rescue a dozen European hostages in the Ethiopian highlands. This involved a purpose-built port and railway on the Red Sea with 13,000 British and Indian soldiers in the mountains along with 26,000 camp followers and more than 40,000 animals including 44 elephants. John has been following their route, partly on foot with a donkey, and has been comparing Eritrea and Ethiopia then and now. He found today's people spirited and energetic, living in dramatic and extremely challenging lands. This talk is history and adventure combined. A writer and broadcaster, for many years with the BBC World Service and Radio 4, John is returning to us by popular demand.

15 March - Keep Calm – I'm an Air Traffic Controller : Phil Holt. Phil has been an Air Traffic Controller for 30+ years and as he quips "I'll keep at it until I get it right". This is a humorous yet factual talk.

19 April - The Women's Land Army: battle of the fields : Gill Clarke, MBE. The work of the Women's Land Army is something of a forgotten history yet it was often done under terrible conditions, but was vital to the war effort, playing a crucial part in increasing levels of productivity from the land in both World Wars.

- Speakers Secretary organising our programme of speakers for our monthly talks and liaising with them over costs and equipment requirements.
- Social Secretary organising, in normal times, a programme of social events such as the Christmas lunch, fish and chip suppers with entertainment, AGM lunches and a Summer party. New ideas would be welcomed.
- Website Manager putting up some of the content, including information on monthly talks, news of events, photographs and documents, contact details and links. The website infrastructure is provided via the Third Age Trust so you need to be comfortable with IT but you do not need to use specialist coding languages.

Plus: another, new, way to be involved - we are thinking of forming a group of volunteers (snappy title needed!) to share tasks such as overseeing and operating our presentation equipment for the monthly talks (projectors, laptop, audio systems); organising the refreshments for these talks; delivering envelopes... Several groups are starting up again, or never stopped! Here are a few examples and updates:

Opera Appreciation - Vanessa Blaber: "We are fortunate in having a very active National Opera Appreciation Coordinator who sends out interesting newsletters each month, suggesting operas that are currently free to watch on line and often providing a link to some musical joke or other. Anything to lighten the worried atmosphere around Covid is welcome.

Obviously we have not been able to meet - normally we are in people's private houses - but we have had a small but determined sub-group who have met most months via Zoom during which we discuss which opera to view on line during the following month which we can then talk about at our next Zoom meeting. By the time you read this we hope we will have re-started "real" meetings. If you would like to join the group please contact me. Most of us are not particularly knowledgeable about opera but enjoy listening to the music."

Petworth Coffee - Tricia Stephens: "We tried to maintain contact during lockdown but having coffee on Zoom failed to attract enough people. Later we met a few times at the United Reformed church hall and took our own refreshments. About six or eight of us met on about three occasions in Rosemary Gardens, taking chairs as well. A bit like camping really! When the Angel's courtyard was opened with a gazebo covering most of the area complete with heating, a crowd of us went there (see photo over the page). It had been snowing that morning but dressed up warm and with four big heaters around us we were warm as toast. In September we met at the New Hungry Guest Cafe at Newlands Gallery. All those present thoroughly enjoy it. A lovely ambiance. Probably we will alternate between the Angel and the cafe so it is important I have your contact details if you wish to join us. On that note I would like to give up the role of group leader at the end of the year so would anyone like to take over, please?"

Dog Walking - Jane Butterfield: "We are walkers who walk dogs as well as ourselves. Our walks are designed to be circular and to limit road work so that we can be relaxed while walking with our dogs. We tend to walk slower than other walking groups as our dogs love playing and running around with the others. The walks average 1.5hrs and we take a stop for refreshments of coffee/biscuits and water for the dogs.

We meet every month on the 3rd Monday at 10am and choose walks that start within 30 mins drive from Midhurst. Men and women are members of our group.

Our walks are all about socialising and enjoying each other's company in the wonderful and varied countryside that we have in this part of West Sussex.

History Two - Christine Musgrove : "We are a small, participatory group presently looking at aspects of the 17th century but interspersing it with occasional discussions on the people, events, or anything else related to history, that attracted us to the subject. Members produce two papers a year which they present to the group although the frequency reduces if the group membership increases! New members are most welcome. We meet 1.00-2.30pm on the 2nd Monday of the month in the Reading Room of the Sanitorium on the King Edward VII Estate."

Boules/Darts - Denise Skinner: "We finished Darts in March 2020 and during lockdown, once we were allowed, we invited groups of four of our members to come for coffee and cake in our house or garden. It was lovely to be able to catch up and to make sure that everyone was coping.

We were unable to play Boules in 2020 but started up again in July this year at the White Horse Easebourne and it has been very enjoyable with a full house most sessions.

We now have a new venue for Darts - The Blue Bell Inn at Cocking."

Discussion - Philip Watts: "The previous two groups have amalgamated but will split again if there is sufficient demand. Currently on zoom but will go live — at a member's home — fairly shortly."

Environment - This new but currently full group are soon to visit the Coultershaw Heritage Site near Petworth.

Computers, Tablets and Smartphones Self-Help - Philip Watts: "This has developed out of the ipad group as all the current problems with ipad have been dealt with! Whilst we will continue to cover the ipad, we also now include Mac and Windows computers and all smartphones and tablets. Group currently full." Could you lead another similar group?

Croquet - The group, run jointly with Arun Valley u3a, started up again in the summer but are now taking a break until April/May next year, weather permitting.

Bus Safaris - Sadly the trip to Haslemere Museum + pub lunch due to take place in September had to be postponed for Covid-related reasons. Let's hope it can happen in the Spring - watch out for more news nearer the time.

Science & Technology - Looking ahead to the Spring, the group are planning a visit to the Weald & Downland Museum with a special tour of the tools and implements in the amazing artefacts store in the Gridshell building. Open to all Midhurst u3a members - look out for further details nearer the time.

Sunday Lunch - Irene Marsh has given up as organiser after several happy years. Would anyone like to take on this sociable role?


Covid-19 Risk Assessments: Group Leaders and event organisers have been sent a check-list and information about procedures to be followed. All members are asked to support them. Personal responsibility: all members are reminded that participants should not attend any u3a events if they are displaying any Covid-19 symptoms even if these symptoms are mild; also not to attend if anyone they live with has symptoms or is feeling unwell or because they have been asked to self-isolate by NHS Test and Trace or are required to isolate after travel. Participants should consider taking a lateral flow test at home prior to attending an event.
