#### Appendix 1 CHAIRMAN'S REPORT - Year to 31 March 2019

This is my first and last Chairman's Report as I am standing down at the AGM after serving three busy but enjoyable years on the Committee.

Our U3A has now been in existence for six and a half years and I am pleased to say we are continuing to attract new members. The latest membership number is 624 compared to about 580 a year ago. So yet more people want to join in the fun of continued learning and the many chances to meet up with old friends and make new friends through a variety of social events.

It is pleasing to see that the number of interest groups has grown again. In addition our links with Kings Norton U3A has led to a joint Circle Dancing group and the opportunity to join in with some new interest groups that they run where we have no similar group ie Birdwatching and Table tennis groups. I hope that this trend will continue and further links with neighbouring U3A's will benefit us all.

Another initiative that has gone from strength to strength is our link with Birmingham University. At two of our monthly meetings we had presentations from students who wanted our help with health related projects they were undertaking. In return the university offers us access to their facilities and provides speakers for some of our interest groups. There will also be further opportunities coming from this source in the year ahead.

You will see from the Treasurer's report that our finances remain healthy with over £5,000 in the bank. Our reserves were much higher in the past but we took the decision a couple of years ago to reduce our reserves to a lower level by reducing the membership fee drastically. Subsequently our fees have gone up but only with the intention of covering increasing costs and breaking even.

Every year some committee members stand down and others join. This year is no different and due to various circumstances there are four people leaving and four people joining. Some of the roles are changing so this is not a like for like swap but I am very grateful to those people who have put their names forward to keep the committee at full strength.

Our vice chair Mike Clark is worthy of special mention. His original intention was to stand down from the committee this year after serving on the committee from the very beginning but as there are so many changes he has agreed to carry on a bit longer in a 'non officer' role to smooth the transition. Mike has been the leading light of our U3A from the very start acting as Chair for three years and Vice Chair for three years. He has also produced our monthly newsletter for over six years when he had a spare minute or two! He is the person we all turn to for advice and support in times of need and so the new committee will be very pleased to still have him around a little bit longer. Thanks to Mike.

Another person who requires special mention is our Business Secretary Diane Worland who is standing down and like Mike she has served on the committee from the very beginning. Three years as an Interest group Co-ordinator and latterly three years as Business Secretary. Diane's main responsibility in recent years has been to organise the various speakers for our monthly meetings. These talks cover a wide variety of subjects ranging through pantomime dames, local history groups, button manufacturers, the National Memorial Arboretum and more recently prefabs, birdwatching and witches. They are always entertaining and informative and as a result attract a large audience. Diane has also been involved in many other activities including organising our Christmas festivities that have always been a great success. Thanks to Diane.

Also leaving us this year are two of the Interest Group Coordinators Chris Olley and Ruth Livermore. Chris has helped on the committee for three years and Ruth one year. Both have helped to grow the number of interest groups and have led the discussions on accessibility for all in our various activities. In addition Chris, has organised the annual Interest Group Leader meetings that have proved very successful in providing a forum for additional training and allowed our Group Leaders to learn best practice from each other. Thanks to Chris and Ruth.

This also leads me on neatly to thanking all our Group Leaders. They are the backbone of our U3A. Thank you Group Leaders!

I also need to mention Yvonne Jackson who had to stand down half way through the year due to health issues. Yvonne was Joint Membership Secretary and was a great contributor in the period she was with us. Thanks to Yvonne.

Another person stepping down is our meeting minute taker Linda Gresham. Linda has been bravely trying to record the 'words of wisdom' emanating at monthly meetings for four years now and thoroughly deserves a rest from the role. **Thanks to Linda**.

Also a big thank you to **all** my continuing committee members for giving up their valuable time and for their never-ending patience in dealing with a myriad of committee issues.

My final thanks go to all the background helpers who contribute so much to the smooth running of our U3A especially those who turn up early and help set up the monthly meetings. I'd particularly like to mention Dave Garfield who sets out the chairs. Special thanks also go to Frank Gresham who sets up the sound system every month and also looks after the website in his 'spare time'. Thanks also to Val Baxter who has helped Jackie with membership duties at renewal time.

I will close by thanking you, the membership, for your continuing support for our thriving U3A.

### TREASURER'S REPORT: 1<sup>st</sup> APRIL 2017 - 31<sup>st</sup> MARCH 2018

This has been the fifth full financial year of our local U3A and the present financial position is a very healthy one. The attached Statement of Accounts shows the balance on the Current Account (the main U3A account) standing at  $\pounds$ 9,201.25. There are no payments to be cleared.

Our income from Subscriptions has decreased over this year as we made the decision last year to halve them from £20 to £10 per annum. We have also had a number of new Interest groups which meant an increase again in AVCs. (Additional Voluntary Contributions made at Interest Group Meetings)

The pattern of expenditure has been broadly similar to that of the previous year. It is worth noting that our dues to the National U3A (The Third Age Trust) for capitation and direct mailing of the magazine, 'Third Age Matters', have increased as charges are based on the total membership of the preceding year. There has been a substantial increase in money spent on Venues for the Interest Groups. We continue to encourage all groups to look at the issue of accessibility so that all can attend the groups they wish to be involved in. This has involved some extra expenditure. We do monitor the amount we get in from AVCS and the amount that is spent. The sum for Transfers seems high but this was money that is paid into the Main account that should have gone into the Social Account.

Members will be aware that a secondary account, the Social Account, was set up to ease the cash-flow of those who organise U3A social events. The 'floating balance' of £1,000 fluctuates as it is drawn upon by organisers (via the Treasurer who prepares the cheques) and then paid back when those participating pay for the trip or event. This account continues to work well and thanks are due to Paul Hunt, our Social Secretary, for continuing to arrange a variety of events; all have been much appreciated by members. Paul has handed on this job to a Committee of people who are continuing the work he started.

This year we have increased the Subscription to £12. The other change is a move to the Beacon system which operates under the auspices of the Third Age Trust. This is a system which makes the administration much easier. We have only just started to use it but one main advantage is that subscriptions can now be renewed through Beacon and the link to our PayPal Account. As of the end of March 90 of you have renewed this way. The other options of paying by cheque and cash are still available but many have welcomed the new option

This has continued to be a busy year for me as Treasurer. I would like to thank all for their help and co-operation which have made my task so much easier. Thanks to Helena Mandleberg for auditing the accounts. Tessa Bidgood Treasurer 24th April 2018

Membership Secretary's report Jackie Spearpoint

You may have noticed that we started out this year with two Membership Secretaries but have ended up with one! At last year's AGM Yvonne Jackson was appointed along with me, but sadly, due mainly to eye problems, things were become tricky for her. At the same time it was becoming

clear that Beacon, the U3A electronic database, was making the task of Membership Secretary much less time-consuming, so Yvonne was able to step down, leaving me to carry on single-handed. The last couple of months have led me to wonder if this decision was a little hasty as I have experienced the considerable workload that the membership renewal period brings with it. It may be that at some point in the coming year we may appeal for someone to help during that time. Our thanks go to Yvonne for her work earlier in the year.

At the start of May we had 624 members, 126 of whom had yet to renew their membership, whilst about 500 have either already renewed or are choosing not to renew for various reasons, such as moving away or having too many other commitments. I am grateful to the majority who have renewed online, which does lighten the workload. Not everyone has found that process straightforward; it has been a learning process for me too, and I have thoughts about how next time I can make instructions even clearer. During this last membership year 118 new members have joined us – all except 4 have email. Our membership is broadly three-quarters female to one quarter male, and 96% have email.

Many of you are aware that, unlike many other U3A's, we do not currently offer Associate membership for a reduced subscription, to those who already belong to another U3A; your new committee will be reviewing this in the year ahead.

My thanks go to Yvonne for her work earlier as we got to grips with our new roles, to Val and Tonia for their work in setting up Beacon – no mean task – leaving us a fully-functioning system, and to you, members, for your support and, when needed, forbearance!
