Scam Watch

Look out for the padlock

A padlock icon prior to a website's name in your browser's heading means it's encrypted. So when you browse, fill in a form or make payments, your details can't be intercepted by scammers.

Most legitimate websites have this feature, so if you notice a site doesn't have one, be suspicious.

Unfortunately, scammers are able to forge or buy these padlocks so seeing one doesn't necessarily mean a website is safe.

Some Actions you can take if you suspect a scam

- Forward suspicious emails to report@phishing.gov.uk
- Forward suspicious text messages to 7726.
- If you feel you have been a victim of a scam notify your bank immediately and report it to www.actionfraud.police.uk
