#### West Wales Network

Newcastle Emlyn U3A is part of the West Wales Network along with nine other U3As in the area. The network meets at least twice a year to support the individual U3As in what they are doing, to arrange training and to be a link to the All Wales Network. At the last meeting in June, at Narberth, the group agreed on a 10p a head capitation fee from all U3A members in order to fund the network.

Future events were discussed and these included an astronomy day in 2017, a history study day, joint quizzes and the possibility of a West Wales Network geology group. Information about these events and others will be in this newsletter so watch this space!

#### Welsh Hearts - the heart charity for Wales

We work within the communities of Wales to provide skills and knowledge which could one day save a life.

One way in which we aim to do this is by providing FREE CPR & Defibrillator training to people within towns and villages. We will be brining our training session for the first time to Newcastle Emlyn on Saturday 13th August. The training will take place between 12-3pm and you would be most welcome to pop in at a time that is convenient. The training session will take place at Cawdor Hall, Castle Street. It is open to all of the general public so please do bring your friends and family along.

In almost three years we have helped to place over 400 defibrillators across the country and have provided free CPR & Defibrillator training to over 12,000 people.
