We were shown the camp itself. It was built just before the war started, on 17 acres of farmland. The majority of POWs were Italian and had shown they could be trusted and able to work in the community. We then moved into the Chapel and learnt of how it came to be and how it has been preserved. All interspersed with many tales and anecdotes, setting the scene as to how life was here at the time of conflict. It ended with tales of how the painter was traced and he and other POWs being welcomed back.

It will be their last tour this year, if any one else would like to go next year do let us know.

To explore more we are going to look at the Philosophy of Education. As it is such a huge subject we are starting "Why do we need Education"
