- *Set on a farm in Suffolk just before WW2 this is a coming of age novel, introducing a girl on the cusp of adulthood. 352 pages*

A Whole Life, Robert Seethaler

- *A young boy living in the Austrian Alps, fights in WW2 and returns to find his world changed. A novel about a simple life with a message of solace and truth. 160 pages*

The Wild Silence, Raynor Winn.

- *Non fiction. Continuing the story of The Salt Path. 288 pages*

- *Explores the intersection between race, class and mental health. 242 pages*

The Lost Rainforests of Britain, Guy Shrubsole
