My opinion is that it will give individual branches a far better say in the decisions made by The Third Age Trust. I am reliably informed by Peacehaven Town Council that this will continue for the foreseeable future. If I have an update with changes I will let you all know.

Thank you to everyone who works so hard to make our branch of the u3a so successful. It just remains for me to wish you all a very enjoyable summer and spring without such a lot of rain!!!



80th Anniversary of D Day Outing—Thursday 12th September Coach & D Day Museum £30 Coach & D Day Museum plus Mary Rose £66



This year will mark the 80th anniversary of D Day. To commemorate this event, we will be organising a trip to Portsmouth in September. The morning will be spent at the wonderful D Day Museum, the only museum in the UK dedicated to the Allied Invasion in June 1944. It tells the unique personal stories behind this epic event. Thanks to the Heritage Lottery Fund, a £5 million redevelopment project was completed in 2018. The museum was transformed to provide an engaging insight into the lives of those who took part in D-Day. whether they were on the shore in Portsmouth, or went over to Normandy.

For the afternoon, there is the option to visit the historic ship, the Mary Rose in the historic Portsmouth Dockyard (£36 extra) or the Gunwharf Quays shopping area.

At the Mary Rose, in addition to the ship itself, there are 3 galleries showing how the men of the Mary Rose lived and worked. This year a new immersive 4D theatre experience opened. It explores the history of when the Mary Rose sank 377 years ago, right up to the present day.




Paying for u3a events and membership

That's why we have been accepting payments in cash, by cheque and by bank transfer for some time. However, during the pandemic many of us got used to paying by card. Please note, if you pay using a card and subsequently require a refund this will be made to your card. However, the card payment company will deduct their fee before the refund is made. The u3a will not be able to make up the difference.
