The Role descriptions of the Chair, Vice Chair and Secretary of Newhaven and Peacehaven u3a

Please note that at this time through personal choice Marian as Chair and Jacquie as Vice Chair fulfil more roles than those that are set out below.

Chair

- Ensure that Newhaven and Peacehaven u3a abides by the principles and ethos of the u3a movement.
- Attend West Sussex Network and Brighton and East Sussex network of u3a's in person or via Zoom. Attend the AGM of National u3a also via Zoom.
- Ensure that speakers and venues are booked for the monthly meetings
- Attend Newhaven and Peacehaven u3a functions and host monthly meetings.
- Ensure that a Risk Assessment has been completed for the venues of monthly meetings.
- Plan the dates and venues for Committee meetings, Chair committee meetings and have a casting vote if necessary. Agree the Agenda with the Secretary.
- Ensure that the committee keeps its ways of working periodically under review.
- Write a Chair's report for the AGM and the Newsletters.
- Be a Trustee of Newhaven and Peacehaven u3a charity.
- Monitor the online bank account.
- Play an active part in Succession Planning and on leaving office carry out a comprehensive hand over to the new Chair

Vice Chair

- Support the Chair in all decisions related to the activities of Newhaven and Peacehaven u3a
- Ensure that Newhaven and Peacehaven u3a abides by the guiding principles of the u3a movement.
- Deputise for the Chair as appropriate.
- Attend u3a functions and host monthly meetings as required
- Play an active part in Succession Planning, on leaving office carry out a comprehensive hand over to the new Vice Chair.

Secretary

- Ask committee members for items for the agenda for committee meetings.
- To liaise with the Chair re items for committee meetings.
- Take the minutes of committee meetings.
- Circulate draft minutes after committee meetings.
- Present the minutes to the next committee meeting for approval.
- Produce the AGM Agenda and supporting documents in consultation with the Committee for circulation to the members.
- Organise the nominations for, and election of Officers and Committee members.
- Check that the AGM is quorate and minute the AGM.
- Act as the custodian of the u3a's constitution.
- Complete the annual return of membership numbers to the Third Age Trust.
- Notify the Third Age Trust Office of all relevant changes to the committee.
- Contact the Third Age Trust Office with insurance claims.
- On leaving office carry out a comprehensive hand over to a new Secretary.

80th Anniversary of D Day Outing



6th June next year will mark the 80th anniversary of D Day. To commemorate this event, we will be organising a trip to Portsmouth in June. The morning will be spent at the wonderful D Day Museum, the only museum in the UK dedicated to the Allied Invasion in June 1944. It tells the unique personal stories behind this epic event. Thanks to the Heritage Lottery Fund, a £5 million redevelopment project was completed in 2018. 



Paying for u3a events and membership

We know that different people like to pay for events in different ways. We believe that we should be as flexible as possible in how we accept payments. That's why we have been accepting payments in cash, by cheque and by bank transfer for some time. However, during the pandemic many of us got used to paying by card. Some of us actually don't carry money around with us any more. So, we have introduced the option for you to pay by card (or even using a smart phone). The choice is yours.

Please note, if you pay using a card and subsequently require a refund this will be made to your card. However, the card payment company will deduct their fee before the refund is made. The u3a will not be able to make up the difference.


Moving house, changing your phone number or email address?

Residues from Events

It is the intention of this u3a that all events (e.g. outings, theatre visits, meals.) be planned to cover their own costs. We do not set out to raise funds from these activities. This is the same principle as applies to Group activities. However, we must not make a loss on either.



The expectation is that they will find a replacement. We offer help in finding a replacement. The one exception to this is where a cost has not been incurred (e.g. an entrance fee) the monies for that part of the initial charge will be refunded.

Due to the popularity of some events, the monies collected are greater than expected or unexpected economies of scale are made due to the use of a larger coach. This leaves a surplus.

- The u3a Committee has agreed the following policy to cover what we will do if there is a surplus.
- If the likely refund per person is £10 or more, then individual refunds will be made.
- If the likely refund per person is less than £10, then the surplus will be used to reduce the cost of future similar events including any losses incurred on similar events.
