The trip will follow the same format as this year. We will be travelling by coach to our Somerset venue and two days of optional excursions are included in the price. This price includes breakfast and evening meal as well as a free bar from 6pm until midnight. There will be the usual high quality evening entertain-

ment that we have come to expect from Warners as well as wide-ranging on-site activities during the day. Cricket St. Thomas is a stately home and as such is one of Warners more upmarket venues. 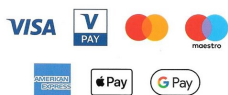

Paying for u3a events and membership

We know that different people like to pay for events in different ways. We believe that we should be as flexible as possible in how we accept payments. That's why we have been accepting payments in cash, by cheque and by bank transfer for some time. However, during the pandemic many of us got use to paying by card. Some of us actually don't carry money around with us any more. So, we have introduced the option for you to pay by card (or even using a smart phone).



The choice is yours.

Voter ID

From 4 May 2023, voters in England will need to show photo ID to vote at polling stations in some elections. If you do not take photo ID with you, you will not be allowed to vote.

This will apply to:

- Local elections
- Police and Crime Commissioner elections
- UK parliamentary by-elections
- Recall petitions

From October 2023 it will also apply to UK General elections.

Acceptable forms of ID to vote in person at a polling station.

- **Passport** issued by the UK, any of the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man, a British Overseas Territory, an EEA state or a Commonwealth country.
- **Driving licence** issued by the UK, any of the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man, or an EEA state (this includes a provisional driving licence).
- **A Blue Badge.**
- **Older Person's Bus Pass.**
- **Disabled Person's Bus Pass.**



If you vote by post this does not affect you.

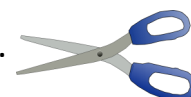

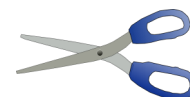

Editors Note: – Newsletter and Bulletin

When I read the Minutes of the March Committee Meeting (which I did not attend) the issue of the confusion between the Newsletter and the Bulletin was once again raised. I therefore thought that it would be worthwhile to give a brief overview of the past and current situation.

When I joined the u3a and the Committee in 2017 the Newsletter was published quarterly (4 times a year) and was printed by a local printing company. The Newsletter and the Monthly Meeting was the only way that we communicated with our members. This caused several problems, the print deadline was 2 weeks before the publishing date, printing was expensive, usually running between 14 to 16 pages and there was no way in which information could be added once the copy had gone to the printer. It was therefore decided to:

1. Purchase a printer and print the newsletter in-house, cheaper and more flexible.
2. Print the Newsletter 3 times a year and issue a monthly Bulletin, cheaper printing and distribution cost.

The Bulletin was intended to be in a digital format, distributed by email, 2 or 3 pages and only include important updates that had occurred between the publication of the newsletters.

Over the past couple of years our u3a has expanded in membership and activities with additions and changes being added monthly. I took the view that if group leaders or members wanted to include something in the Bulletin I would include it. There are no printing costs associated with the Bulletin and the only limitation is the file size for distribution. There have been issues reaching 16 pages so I can understand why some members are getting confused, although the layout and title pages of the publications are totally different.

We are now a quarter of the way through 2023 and times have changed. We have 337 members of which approximately 85% have an email address. Tony is very active and we have a webpage, and a presence on Facebook and YouTube. All of the information contained in the Newsletter and Bulletin can be found there so we have questioned the need for continuing to printing the Newsletter and publishing the Bulletin.

The Committee has decided that there is still a need for both and back in August 2022 the following Guidelines for the Publication of the Bulletin were agreed:

1. The number of pages will not be subject to a pre-determined limit and will be at the discretion of the Editor
2. The font type and size will remain at the current size
3. Only new items or events that have not occurred or still have vacancies since the last publication of the Bulletin will be included
4. The detail of the Interest Groups information will be decided by the Group Coordinator
5. The Dates for your Diary will be included

On a final note, the publication and distribution of the Newsletter and Bulletin is not just down to me but a hard working team, and yes, both the Newsletter and the Bulletin are proof-read and I apologise for the errors that are my mistake. Some of the errors occur because updated information has not been passed onto me, but as they say, no one is perfect.
