

Pilot Council Meeting: 14th June 2023

This Summary Report may be used and shared with any u3a members.

This was an in-person meeting held in London and the second of this model of the Pilot Council to be trialled.

- The record of the previous meeting was accepted as accurate with minor amendments. It was noted that, as the meeting is still a trial, the record should be classified as notes rather than formal minutes.
- Council membership: attendees were reminded that this model of the Pilot Council was still a trial and therefore the same people might not necessarily be participants in the next meeting.
- Two-way communication with u3as: the meeting heard a presentation on progress made so far. The number of members receiving the Newsletter is increasing. In discussion it was highlighted that it is vital that the Council engages with u3as across the movement and a long discussion was held on how this might be achieved. It is recognised that there is room for improvement in the present system but generally agreed that the Council offers an ideal opportunity for u3as to become more involved. This will be discussed further at the next meeting.
- Constitutions: The proposal from the Governance Committee to consider easing stipulations in the model Constitution in line with Charity Commission requirements was welcomed.
- Paid Tutors: this subject was deferred to the next meeting.
- Future Committee Structure. The meeting was informed that the Learning, Development and CEAK committees are being stood down in their present form. The review is ongoing and will tie the structure and

- strategy together. Committees will become "Groups" which is more inclusive as it will allow members of staff to participate fully.
- Festival 2024 will take place on the campus of York University showcasing u3a activities, with music, tours and tournaments. The provisional date is 17 to 19 July 2024 Organisers were requested to confirm this a.s.a.p. for planning purposes. U3as are encouraged not to schedule any events during this period.
- Email address: the u3a Office has set up a dedicated address to which u3as may send suggestions or requests for items they would like the Council to consider. council@u3a.org.uk
- Member Added Value the meeting heard an overview of the Parliament Hill proposal which aims to add value to the u3a membership through offers. These discounts for products and services have come about in response to member requests.
- **u3a Week 2023** is 18th to 22nd September. The coordinator this year is Margaret Fiddes.
- Matters for the next meeting: all u3as are requested to send in items that they would like discussed by 20th August for consideration at the 20th September meeting.
