#### **Chair's Report**

#### A Happy New Year to all Northumbria Region u3a members.

Northumbria Regional Committee and the new North East Trustee Jean Cubbin are pleased to announce that Liz Thackary, Chair of the Third Age Trust is coming to the Northumbria Region for a five day visit at the beginning of April 2024. A programme, where she can visit u3as in the North and the South of the Region, will be planned.

Information has been sent to all Chairs, Business Secretaries and 'leads' of Networks, as well as being placed on the Regional website with regard to Liz Thackary's forth coming visit. They have been invited to register their interest if they would like Liz to visit their own u3a.

It's the start of a New Year and behind the scenes the Northumbria Regional Committee and the Regional Events Team have been organising many social events, workshops and meetings for 2024. One of the objectives in the Region's three-year plan 2023- 2026 is to enable members to network, so providing support for all members. Organising events, workshops and meetings enables everyone to come together from every part of the Region.

There have been many discussions at the Third Age Trust since the National AGM in October 2023 about 'Fit for the Future' and the formation of a Pilot Council. If you would like to find out more about this venture please click on this link. u3a - Fit for the Future

The Third Age Trust has four strategies to support the u3a movement.

- 1. To promote a u3a collective identity (Single u3a)
- 2. To maximise the benefits of u3a membership to current members and to attract the next generation (**Next Gen**)
- 3. To advance an exciting u3a learning experience (Enjoy)
- 4. To collaborate with like-minded organisations at all levels of the movement (Emerge and Collaborate)

A new initiative by Northumbria Region is to create more Interest/Subject Group Networks. In November 2023 a new Art Network held its first meeting via Zoom, hosted by Catherine Stevenson of Newcastle u3a. In January 2024 a Geology Network is to hold its first Zoom meeting hosted by Elizabeth Devon of Duns and District u3a, Scotland. Elizabeth runs the Wooler u3a Geology Group. This will

be our first cross border Network. Anne Walsh, Chair of Scotland u3a is delighted this project is taking place.

Our next Regional Quarterly Meeting will be held at Brunswick Hall, Newcastle on January 25<sup>th</sup> 2024. If you do come along to the meeting which will be full of news, networking and of course fun please say *Hello* to me. It would be great to put a name to a face or vice versa.

#### **Regional Birdwatching Network**



The group had its beginnings in 1998 with half day excursions held after the Wearside U3A monthly coffee mornings, the embryo idea being that members could travel to meet up with birdwatchers from other u3a groups in the region at their local nature reserves etc.

Thus, after prior contact by Wearsides, John Lloyd, the first get together was arranged with Whickham u3ain May 1999, when four of their members were met at Shibdon Pond Nature reserve in Blaydon, and the combined party viewed the birds present.

The next joint excursion was held with two members from Ryton and district u3a, with Wallsend Swallow Pond as the venue, soon followed by meetings with birding groups from Newcastle and Washington u3a s in January 2000.



Subsequently as the word spread, the number of u3as with participants mushroomed, the half day outings became full day trips and the frequency of visits increased.

From these modest beginnings, although in the main the group continues to visit local venues, over the years trips much further afield have been arranged requiring overnight or longer stays, e.g. three days at Bamburgh, four days at Southport, and an almost annual visit to South West Scotland to see the geese and birds of prey, 5 days on the Island of Mull and a week on Majorca.

At different times over the period, birders from a dozen u3a groups have participated, including members from Cockermouth, Chester, and Newquay u3as.



Initially four of us led the outings, but illness and the pandemic caused the group to wither on the vine, but it is hoped to revive the group in 2024 with 3 leaders, as one of the original leaders is now in a care home. (We sorely miss her expertise).

The group would not have functioned so well without other members helping by giving lifts to people

without cars, and helping to arrange accommodation, the Xmas lunches and occasional birthday parties.

On trips abroad, we use a local guide who knows the best places to look. We have been to Spain, Hungary, Bulgaria, Morocco, Estonia, Menorca, Poland and Finland.

We desperately need some younger members as many of the original members are now octogenarians and not fit enough to go out other than to watch from a car.



We are planning to arrange two more quizzes in 2024 – summer and winter, so keep an eye on the Regional Website and their Facebook page for details.








#### Northumbria Region u3a Creative Writers

We are planning a Celebration of Music for all u3a members in the Northumbria Region u3a. It will be in the concert room in Sunniside Club, Sunniside Road, NE16 5NA on Thursday June 6<sup>th</sup> 2024, which is close to the Metro Centre in Gateshead, see below:

This is a fabulous room with stage and PA sound system and the club has good car parking. We are hoping the event will attract many members from our region, who will attend as either a performer or spectator. The day is planned to have three parts:

Part 1: Starts at 3pm to 5pm and during this period we are hoping that many individual/solo members will contribute, regardless of level of talent. Perhaps sing a song or play a tune on guitar, violin, flute or piano (full electric piano available) etc. This will be a little like a 'Buskers Night' so please don't be shy to perform, we are all amateurs!

Part 2: Buffet, 5pm to 6pm. During this hour a buffet will be available for those who have paid for it at £7. (Details of how to pay this before the day will be made available.)

Part 3: This will be from 6pm to 9pm. During this time, it is hoped that there will be existing duos or bands or groups in our u3as that have a little more performance experience and we hope these will contribute in this Part.

Individual performers will have to be a member of a u3a, but duos or bands can also perform provided at least one member of the band is a u3a member. I must emphasise that the day is aimed to be a fun-day with nothing too serious! Spectators will be asked to pay an entrance fee of £5 for the day but performers will not pay the entrance fee in return for their efforts!

However, before we can confirm to all members that the event will take place, we first have to ensure that we have enough members prepared to perform to make the day a success.

The Regional Committee are wanting to organise Regional Quarterly Meetings in the whole of the Region, both North and South.




