Reserves - Roy W

At September's AGM, it was agreed that the new Committee would review the level of reserves held and consider whether this might now be reduced as we no longer face the uncertainties of the last couple of years. The u3a National guidance does not specify the level of reserves that should be maintained but, as a minimum, there should be sufficient to enable the charity to function for at least six months. Most use a 12-month operating period as a safe target and this has been our u3a's policy to date.

The new Committee has now reviewed our reserves policy, taking into account our recent accounting history, future running costs, the need to provide for future capital expenditure (especially the replacement of existing equipment), current uncertainty about inflation, the desirability of not subjecting members to fluctuations in membership fees and, of course, fairness to our members.

The Committee have therefore decided that, in keeping with many other u3a groups, we will aim to maintain reserves, as now, at the level of one year's income. It is, of course, difficult to predict future income and costs with any certainty. So, the Committee will continue to keep the level of reserves under review and any significant fluctuation will be taken into account when setting membership fees.
