Are you an experienced dressmaker and looking to meet likeminded sewers? Would you like to learn to make your own clothes in a relaxed, friendly environment? Maybe you would like to re-kindle your skills, exchange ideas or learn a new technique?

There's a proposal to bring together experienced dressmakers in a friendly comfortable environment in a local dedicated sewing room on

New Road. If you already sew and would like company as you stitch away, you would be very welcome. Maybe you would like to learn how to make clothes, in which case help and advice will be on hand from a qualified seamstress. Even if it's a long time since you picked up a needle or pulled the sewing machine out of hiding, make 2023 your year to start again!

The plan is to hold a meeting each month in the dedicated sewing room, with perhaps a midmonth meeting in a tranquil home setting to discuss ideas and complete hand sewing. Training can be offered for specific techniques such as buttonholes, tailoring, inserting zips and so on.

Fantasy, Fable or Fright?

Whatever your thoughts are around climate change, they will shift when you watch this recorded talk by **Brenda Ainsley**, a founder member and strong leader in the u3a's Online Interest Group "Countdown to COP". Her talks have been published and broadcast across the u3a and acclaimed as "**Quite the best explanation of climate change**".

This talk presents facts alongside well-considered opinion, drawing a full portrait of a situation about which all of us should be aware and well informed. Brenda uses everyday language to show how human activity, over the past couple of centuries, has so adversely affected our planet's atmosphere that already, in 2023, it can no longer support several forms of terrestrial life. She shows us that although this situation is continuing to deteriorate, we can still act to reverse its effects.

This talk answers many of the queries that you may have about climate change, and any remaining questions can be debated in our discussion after the presentation.

Monthly Meeting Write Up

March 2023 Monthly Meeting - Sing A Century, Andy Smith

We were entertained this month by singer / songwriter Andy Smith who took us on a musical journey from the 1920s to the 2000s. We started in the 1960s with "Norwegian Wood" by The Beatles, and quickly realised we were in for an afternoon of excellent guitar & ukulele musicianship with humorous storytelling to accompany each song. This was followed by "Vincent" by Don Maclean (70s) and then onto "I get a Kick' by Cole Porter (30s) on the ukulele, with Andy choosing to use the original more controversial lyrics!

He explained how he struggled to enjoy some later music but played a sympathetic rendition of "Wonderwall" by Oasis (90s) before whizzing us off to 1940s Casablanca with "As Time Goes By". Back to the 60s for the hilarious "Sister Josephine" by Jake Thackeray, and more up to date into the 2010s with Joe Brown's "Tickle my Heart" and a heartfelt rendition of Adele's version of Bob Dylan's "Make You Feel my Love" from the 2000s. Then we heard "Ain't No Pleasing You" by Chas & Dave (80s) followed by one of Andy's own compositions from the 90s for his late wife – a beautiful song called "When all is said and done".

Afterwards, back to familiar territory with Buddy Holly songs "Raining in my Heart" and "Peggy Sue" (50s) on the tenor guitar, before Andy finally drew the trip through the decades to a close, finishing with "I'll See You in my Dreams" from the 1920s. If the noises of appreciation and participation heard on the video recorded are anything to go by, it was a very enjoyable afternoon!
