Environmental Discussion

We met this month to watch a video of a talk given by **Brenda Ainsley**, a strong leader in the Trust u3a's Interest Group <u>Countdown to COP</u>. Brenda's recorded presentation, "**The Climate Crisis and Some Solutions**", explained the extent of the problems caused as a result of human activities and the potential consequences of not taking any action to mitigate climate change.

Brenda explained the many positive actions that are being taken around the world such as alternative energy production from solar and wind; the signing up of nations to the Paris Agreement (although with limitations to commit to a temperature rise this century of less than 2° C, rather than the 1.5° C that scientists recommend); and the development of carbon capture technologies. Her talk ended with a quote from the House of Lords report of last year, "Behaviour change across the whole population is essential to meet net zero and reduce environmental harms", and suggested some thoughts and actions for all of us:

- Transport consider electric vehicles, use public transport
- Heating our homes think about improving insulation, solar panels, heat pumps
- Use our vote vote for local councils and MPs with good environmental track records
- Ask questions are the groups we belong to as "green as they could be? Do the banks they use invest in fossil fuels?
- Use our voice talk to family and friends to raise their awareness of the issues and encourage them to make consumer choices that make a difference (tip: the search engine Ecosia plants trees every time it is used over 170 million to date).

Monthly Meeting Write Up

April 2023 Monthly Meeting - Jardin Serre De La Madone, Duncan Coombes

On a cool April afternoon in Pershore, we were transported to the south of France, overlooking the Mediterranean, when through his words and photos, Duncan Coombes invited us to experience "The Other Hidcote", the Jardin Serre de la Madone near Menton. He certainly captured the essence of a beautiful garden, which flourished from 1937 onwards.

Jardin Serre de la Madone occupies an area of 9 hectares from sea level, sloping up through terraces to a Mediterranean forest. The garden was created by Lawrence Johnston, b. 1871, the designer at Hidcote. We learned about Johnston's life, and inheritance which helped him acquire Hidcote and Serre de la Madone. He served 20 years in the army and after his retirement, moved to France continuing his passion for travel and plant collecting, both himself and sponsoring others, in Africa, Asia and South America. The exotic specimens collected were grown at either Hidcote or in France to see which conditions suited best. Johnston died at Menton in 1958.

We journeyed with Duncan from the plant house, via the water garden, conservatory, old rose garden, now an acacia garden, through the citrus garden and courtyard replete with mandarin trees, to the house. He showed us many photos of unusual and exotic plants thriving in the temperate climate of southern France.

The garden has been allowed to fall into a semi derelict state in recent years, but we could appreciate its beauty and many of us were left thinking we would love to visit!
