The less obvious costs to human health can be life changing. Water Companies pay astonishing sums in fines, but continue to flout the law.

Come and hear Dr Geoff Sallis talk about the problems of river pollution, and learn how we could help with a new, local water sampling project.

There will be a small charge on the day to cover room hire.

Dr Geoff Sallis has been working on a new project, which will collect River Avon samples and compile and present an authoritative report. Most importantly, the aim is to bring these issues into wider public and governmental awareness. He is working to get this initiative off the ground between Stratford and Tewksbury, and is keen to recruit volunteers locally.

We've invited Dr Sallis to speak at our meeting at **2pm**, **Thurs**, **Oct 12**th **at the Riverside Centre**, where he will spell out the problems with river pollution and recruit help with this new project. Councillor Dan Boatright will also speak to inform us of progress with local groups. Everyone is welcome to attend this meeting to learn more about these problems, find out how we can help to tackle them together through the river sampling project, and raise and discuss any questions you may have.

Monthly Meeting Write Up

Inflammation a right pain in the neck

In September Dr Graham Cope returned to give us the third in a series of talks: proceeding Bacteria and Gut Health, the focus this time was upon Inflammation which is the body's natural response to infection and wound healing, but it sometimes overreacts, causing problems.

Via a series of cartoons and easy to follow scientific diagrams, Graham took us through the roles of various white blood cells: fighting pathogens; producing antibodies – always ready to attack. But he reminded us of the danger of this during Covid, when the human body had no learned immune response to the virus and released too many 'cytokines' in response.

We then learned about the role of vitamins within the body and how we can boost our immune systems by eating a balanced diet with lots of fibre, taking exercise in the fresh air, keeping hydrated and not smoking or consuming excess alcohol. His only recommendation was to take Vitamin D supplements as we may not absorb enough from the sun in the Northern hemisphere, especially in the winter. There may have been a rush on leafy vegetables afterwards too!

Finally, Graham shared his own recent history of developing lymphoma and then succumbing to shingles. This was a timely reminder to get the vaccination offered at the moment!
