Via [subject networks](#) you can play bridge online, join the Walkers Exchange to share local walks in different areas, share craft ideas and successes, and more.

The [National Learning Initiative](#) offers competitions and writing projects, or test your brain with logic puzzles, and the [Research and Shared Learning network](#) tells you about projects you can contribute to as well as giving help and advice on how to start one of your own. If there is a group you would like to see in our u3a, the network of [national subject advisers](#) offers support with starting a group in their speciality area, and new ideas, resources or a different approach if your group needs some fresh thinking.

If you want to share what your group is up to, the [u3a radio podcast](#) showcases the amazing things happening across the u3a movement. [Latest news](#) is another great place to find uplifting stories – I loved reading about Hayling Island's Sea Shanty singing group (the video is brilliant!) - and [u3a Sources](#) is full of inspiring stories; have you heard about u3a Festival 24 taking place at York University next year? 


## Interest Groups' Latest News from John

### Citizen Science project monitors the River Avon

Water companies are frequently in the news, and not for good reasons. If not news about discharging untreated sewage into our rivers, it's about pollution caused by run-off from farming. Keen to know more, Environmental Discussion group invited Dr Geoff Sallis to talk about his project to research the health of the River Avon.

Geoff explained that commonly, we have old, combined sewer systems that carry both surface and foul water from homes and industry in one pipe. Storm overflows discharge excess water (and untreated sewage) into rivers when the system gets too full, such as at times of heavy rainfall. Property developers are still permitted to connect surface water drainage pipes to old, combined sewer systems, so with all the new houses being built, overloads are happening much more often – in 2021, there were over 370,000 discharges totalling over 2.7 million hours of pollution. Alongside this, since 2011 the Environment Agency's budget has been cut by 75% and prosecutions for pollution are down by 95%.



Geoff's project engages local groups to become Citizen Scientists and trains them in how to regularly take water samples and test them for pollution levels. An app is used to record the data, which is analysed over time to build up a picture of the River Avon's health. Samples taken from other sites frequently show worryingly high levels of phosphate and nitrate pollution and Geoff wants to find out

whether Pershore is the same, so members of Environmental Discussion group will be getting involved and a water sampling training session is being organised. If you are interested in taking part, please get in touch on the email below.

Geoff is keen to spread the word to other local groups that might take part in his project – as well as sampling, help is needed to collate and analyse data over time, build a website and keep track of people and groups interested in the project. If you are a member of a local or community group

that might like to get involved, or simply hear more about this interesting project, Geoff would be very happy to come along and talk to your group.
