



he English Literature group had a lively discussion on the topic of Black American literature.


Merle Traves led the discussion and had circulated a very well researched paper to the group.


History

This month Stephen Winwood led a lively discussion about religion in the Tudor period. He told us about the everyday changes to how the local church might have appeared and how some aspects of the traditional church service changed.

We tried to imagine how much of the complex issues and ideas that we now call The Reformation would have made sense to the average parishioner.


