



Wider u3a networks

Ithough the Pontesbury and Rea Valley u3a stands as an entirely independent organisation, it is linked at several levels to the wider regional and national u3a Trust.

Shropshire & Wolverhampton

We take part in the Shropshire & Wolverhampton Network. Almost the u3as in the area participate in this network and send a representative to the meetings which take place about every 4 months. There is a similar level of commitment to the regular meetings of the u3a chairs.

Meetings

During covid we have been meeting more often but on-line. This proved really valuable as it provided not only an opportunity to share the challenges we faced in keeping going during the periods of restrictions but more importantly we were able to share good practice. As things slowly move back something like normality we will put in place additional network meetings for committee members with specific roles such as treasurers; again to share good practice. Next year we are hoping to put on a network event open to all our members.

History Group

Ithough we have very healthy numbers we are always looking for new recruits. We are about to move into very new territory for us - the history of Japan. None of us would claim much (if any!) prior knowledge on this subject but that is what the u3a is all aboutlaunching into new areas of learning or activity - as with the Starship Enterprise - "to boldly go..."

We will start with a very broad brush outline of the shape of Japanese history and then decide which parts want to concentrate on. Japan should provide a fascinating area of study. Much of our school history was almost entirely focused on Europe, virtually ignoring

massive influence and richness of non-European civilisations.

Japan is also likely to interesting because, unlike most areas and peoples of Asia, Africa and the Americas, it was never colonised by the Europeans and it developed its own unique culture. It also developed at break-neck speed from the late nineteenth century onwards to become one of the great economic and technological powers of the world.


