Open meeting: "The Fiddle" by Natalie Cumming - Wed 15 June 2pm

hatever you do, put this date in your diary for this unmissable fascinating talk by Natalie Cumming, Shropshire resident and author of "The Fiddle", on the remarkable true story of a family violin from Russia, Germany to the UK; through war and terror, concentration camps to safety in the present day - highlighting some of the most important events in modern history.

In January 2018, the violin featured in BBC 2's, "The Repair Shop"., It has now been donated to the Yehudi Menuhin School of Music and is played every day by a young virtuoso.

Natalie started work aged 17 as a secretary at Gillette Industries. In 1970 she moved into merchant banking, as a personal assistant in the City of London with Lord Kissin of the Guinness Peat Group, finally working with Jacob Rothschild, Chairman of the Five Arrows Group, before retiring.

She became a Freeman of the City of London in 1983 and Member of the Guild of Freemen in 2003. After becoming a supporter of the Missing People Charity in 1986, she served as a Trustee from 1990 to 2007 and continues her involvement.





a) How many squares, of any size, are there in the following diagram?




b) How many squares and triangles of any size are in the following diagram?

he geology group visited the world famous Onny river valley geological section, to see a variety of sedimentary rocks and fossils of mainly Ordovician Age. While no Trilobites samples were found, we did find lots of Brachiopods.

We were also able to locate one unconformity between the Ordovician and Silurian. However, the second unconformity separating Pre Cambrian rocks below was a little more difficult to see in the dense vegetation.

The walk along the disused railway by the Onny River was very pleasant with bluebells and wild garlic in full bloom and is highly recommended even for non geologists.


At our June meeting, we shall be discussing Tolstoy's famous novel Anna Karenina (all 940 pages!)


