New to the village and the u3a, my husband Steve joined early this year and has been warmly welcomed. Ever since, our mailbox has overflowed with friendly banter!

In Mal's own words in one such email he describes how he feels about the group:

I cannot imagine ever being a part of such a talented, humorous, supportive, lively group of kindly individuals as these.

The folk music group has been meeting for five years. From small beginnings, they started with four members, meeting in each others houses until the membership grew and a room was hired in the Congregational Church.

As the membership grew they moved to the present venue in Minsterley Parish Hall and meet every Monday (2pm - 4pm).

It is an inclusive group, with both singers and instrument players (guitar, banjo, fiddle, mandolin, mountain dulcimer, concertina and diddly-bo)., covering a wide range of traditional and modern folk songs and self penned pieces.

Several group members have joined and formed splinter liaisons, Tin Soldier, The Ketchen's Duo and a



seven member female group (name to be decided) who have recorded a traditional song (Bonnie Pit Laddie) available on mp3.




