

Open meetings are available to both members and non-members alike, so bring along a friend if you wish. Refreshments will be served afterwards. Please come and join us for a fascinating presentation.





Treasurer Needed!

our u3a committee is in need of a new treasurer as John Rice will be leaving this role shortly.

The treasurer is one of the four members of the committee that we have to have in place in order for our u3a group to function – it is an important but relatively straightforward role so I hope that someone from amongst our membership will feel able to volunteer and join our friendly and enthusiastic committee.

Before I became the chair I had been treasurer for three years and I will therefore be able to coach/advise/mentor/support the new incumbent in the first few months.

We bank with the TSB and use their on-line banking service for most of the transactions. Any cash that we have to do deal with can be paid in at the post office within Connections. Most of our members pay their yearly subscription via BACS and we pay our hall rental and speakers' fees via BACS as well. Some of the interest groups collect subscriptions and these are then passed on to the treasurer every so often, who then pays in the money and pays the relevant hall rental





fees via BACS. We also pay our central u3a subscriptions via BACS

At our (usually) monthly committee meetings the treasurer gives an update as to the state of the finances and at the end of the financial year the accounts are checked/audited and then presented at the AGM in July.

In the next few months we are likely to start using a central u3a information management tool (Beacon) and this will make the financial record keeping and reporting easier to manage.

It is really important that we find someone who can take over this role so if you think you might be interested then please let me know – you won't be committing to anything at that stage and if you think it is something you would like to do you can be assured of a warm welcome from the committee and plenty of help and support.


We are delighted that Elizabeth Knowles, one of our number, has recently published her novel 'No Straight Road', set during the Spanish Civil War.

Rosa Parks

Rosa Parks will forever be remembered for the Alabama Bus incident, where she was arrested in 1955 for not agreeing to vacate her seat in the segregated 'coloured' section of the bus in favour of a 'White' passenger.

She helped inspire the 'Black' community to boycott the town's buses for over a year. It eventually led to a Supreme Court ruling that bus segregation was unconstitutional.

She continued to be outspoken on racial prejudice for the remainder of her life.

Recognised as an icon for freedom in America she was awarded with the Congressional Gold Medal.

Eleanor of Aquitaine

orn in 1122 when woman had little or no say in political matters, Eleanor of Aquitaine became one the most powerful and influential women of the Middle Ages. Inheriting a vast estate at the age of fifteen made her the most sought-after bride of her She married Louis generation. who within months became the King of France and she was crowned Queen. She later joined her husband on a crusade to the Holy Land.

Becoming increasingly estranged from her husband, her marriage to the King of France was annulled and within two months she married Henry who later became Henry II of England, making her Queen of England. Two of their sons became future Kings of England, Richard I (the Lionheart) and John and one of her grandsons, Henry III.


The next films on the 17th February is "Arthur's Dyke".

At the February group meeting, members are invited to bring along family treasures or memorabilia. It will be fascinating to see what objects are presented and the stories behind them.



James Stanley Wood (1874–1954)

In January, Nancy Ketchen gave a very interesting presentation about her grandfather James Stanley Wood (1874–1954).

Overcoming research difficulties

Despite extensive research Nancy initially struggled to discover any facts about her grandfather. However, once she noticed an incorrect entry in the 1881 Census where his name had been misspelt as Jane, things became much easier. It became apparent that both of his parents and elder sister had died when he was only 5 years old and he was brought up by his uncle and aunt. Other extended family members took in his three other sisters.

A glass maker and painter

James became an apprentice glassmaker at the Pilkington's Factory, eventually becoming a glass painter. By 1911, he and his wife Alice had five living children and he ran his own company designing and making windows for churches.

Unfortunately, much of his work was lost owing to extensive bombing during WWII.

A remaining window

However, Nancy has managed to 'track-down' at least one remaining window which sits in the church of Our Lady in Neston on the Wirral.
