#### Local History: Shrewsbury Flaxmill Maltings

Speaker: Penny Ward

Date: Tuesday 21 March

Time: 2pm

he Local History interest group welcomes all Pontesbury & Rea Valley u3a members to a Penny talk by Ward Shrewsbury Flaxmill Maltings; the first iron framed building and blueprint for the skyscrapers that followed, at Minsterley Parish Hall on Tuesday 21st March 2023 at 2pm with a cost of £6 maximum, but this could reduce to £5, depending on numbers, to cover costs, hall hire and refreshments.

Penny Ward studied Archaeology at Cardiff in the 1970s managed the Shropshire Historic Environment Record for several decades until her retirement in 2016. She has been involved with the Shrewsbury Flaxmill Maltings since 2005, when English Heritage (now Historic England) took over the site and asked for volunteers to assist on Heritage Open Days. Her talk will tell the story of the site, from the revolutionary use of cast iron in its construction at the end of the eighteenth century up to the latest phase in its existence which began in September last year when the ground floor of the now restored Main Mill building opened to the public. It will also give some account of the Flax Mill's Bleach Works at Hanwood.

Please contact Susan Lockwood if you wish to attend so she knows how many people to cater for. The larger hall may need to be hired if she receives more than 5 responses from the wider membership. If a high turnout is expected, there will be cake as well!


## Feedback from February's Open meeting


#### Rosalind Franklin

Rosalind (1920-1958) was a British chemist whose work was central to the understanding of the molecular structures of DNA...

Although her works on viruses were appreciated in her lifetime, her enormous contributions to the discovery of the structure of DNA were largely unrecognized during her life, for which she has been variously referred to as the 'forgotten heroine'.

Much of her work was used by others who then received the credit.

In 2021 the Rosalind Franklin laboratory was opened and became the largest laboratory for Covid testing in the UK.

#### Elsie Widdowson


Elsie Widdowson (1906-2000), British dietitian and who largely nutritionist was responsible for overseeing the government-mandated addition vitamins food to wartime rationing in Britain during World War II. In 2020, she was included in a list of seven important but little-known British female scientists.
