



Two people, Roy Forbes and Ray Graham, are so far very interested in Model Railways and in forming a u3a Model Railway Group. It's not necessary to have your own layout or even be a collector but if you do have some interest in modelling especially related to railways, even if it is just watching trains running around a layout, then you will be made most welcome.

Roy has his own OO gauge layout, which he is in the process of rebuilding after a house move 3 years ago, housed in a purpose built 'shed' (20feet by 10feet). His previous layout was 30 feet by 6 feet. So at present the new layout is a bit of a mess as the work is still 'in progress'.


