We are not having an Open









White Ship-1120



From Sue Piggott-Forster we heard about the White Ship that sailed from France in 1120 and became one of the greatest tragedies to ever hit England when it sank, killing William, the only legitimate heir to the throne. His decision to sail on that ship and the decision of Stephen of Blois not to, changed the course of British History.

Beaufighter crash—WW11 1942



Colin Stegeman then told us about a tragic accident during WWII when the pilot of a Beaufighter aircraft decided during take-off. It crashed near Richmond killing both men on board.

Finally, there was a presentation covering the meeting of a very young Paul and John in July 1957 at a church fete in Woolton, Liverpool. After a meeting lasting just one hour John asked Paul to join his band (The Quarrymen), resulting in the birth of the Beatles who became the most successful and influential band of all time. Not only did they put Liverpool on the map and influence the music business but helped to grow the economy and change the British class system.


