On the subject of Open Meetings – our next one is a bit special – Wednesday 20 March at 2.00pm at




Minsterley Parish Hall – so definitely save the date. Full details are contained in this newsletter.

his will be one of the most profoundly moving stories you have ever heard. This really is an unmissable talk by local resident and famous singer, Val Sinclair and her sister Jo Morrison; "Searching for Jo".

Val was 7 years old when her sister

Jo was born. She remembers being allowed a quick look at the 'new born' but it was to be over 40 years before the sisters finally met again. For a number of years Val and Jo never 'went public', they spent months getting to know one another, even before meeting each other's husbands and children but they all finally fell together as a happy family.

Eventually they felt able to give their first public talk and were interviewed on the BBC's Woman's Hour programme which was looking at the new Adoption Bill (their real names were withheld). This heart-warming account will be of interest to anyone affected by adoption, anyone searching for a relative or those who would just like to listen to what Jo and Val describe as "the most momentous thing that ever happened in their lives".

This is a remarkable story of the reasons surrounding Jo's adoption, the search for Jo, the role of NORCAP, finding Jo, the post-reunion path and 'nature versus nurture'.



By popular demand, Val and Clive Butterworth will end with a couple of songs.


