In May there will be no Open Meeting as there will be a get-together for




Group Coordinators and will give them a chance to catch up and share ideas and future plans. Coordinators and deputies will be contacted shortly.

His Antarctic experience includes 20 summer seasons and 2 winters over 50 years. He is the holder of the Polar Medal and current president of the UK Antarctic Club.




space allows, an affiliate member can then become a full member if they wish.
