U3a members are being asked to take part in <u>The Big Plastic</u> <u>Count</u>, the UK's largest investigation into household plastic waste. The goal of Everyday Plastic and Greenpeace is to highlight the urgency and scale of the plastic problem and empower individuals to play a part in solving the plastic crisis.


If you'd like to take part, register at <u>thebigplasticcount.com/U3A</u>, then count your plastic waste for one week (from 11-17 March) and submit your results online. You will get your personal household plastic footprint and help reveal how much plastic we are throwing away as a nation. The aim is to use the results to convince UK ministers to lead the way at <u>global talks that could</u> finally phase out plastic pollution for good.
