Members have to make their own way there and meet punctually at 10 a.m. at the venue:

Veolia, Warren Way, Crown Farm Industrial Park, Forest Town, Mansfield NG19 OFL There is no charge. The visit lasts 2 hours.

The working site is only accessible by an outdoor gridded metal staircase and consequently is not considered suitable for wheelchair users or visitors with mobility issues.

The staircase is quite steep and, whilst most visitors do not have any difficulty in using this, it may make some visitors reluctant to take part.

Sensible flat, covered footwear or walking boots must be worn by all visitors. Hard hats and high visibility jackets will be provided for the site tour. As this is a working industrial site, all members taking part will be issued with a site-specific risk assessment to read and acknowledge prior to the visit.

There will be a sign-up sheet on the trips table at Tuesday's AGM.

Following the visit, Chris Dean is organising an informal lunch at the Widecombe Fair Pub & Grill near the Oak Tree crossroads, but needs to know numbers in order to reserve places. Wakefield National Mining Museum Wednesday August 2nd.

Cost for entry and travel is £15.

An underground tour of the mine is included and this lasts for 1 hour and 20 minutes.

There are various exhibitions and stories relating to the coal mining industry and these are in the museum on ground level.

The cost for travel is £15 with free entry to the museum and art gallery.

IWM exhibitions include hand crafted ceramic poppies, timeline with key events of global conflicts. Suggested timing for IWM is 2 hours but you may prefer a longer time.

Lowry galleries include works by LS Lowry and other modern artists. Suggested timing for the gallery is 45 minutes.
