Come along and hear about the **The Bentley Boys - the story of Motor Car Racing in the 1920's**.








Join us for an enjoyable meeting with refreshments and socialising in the break, plus news of Ru3a events & trips!

Finally, Bob & Val Ford from our **Yoga & Chair Yoga** Groups led us through a seated stretching and relaxation session



All trips leave the Sherwood Ranger at 9.30 a.m. and depart from the venue at approximately 3pm unless stated otherwise.

IMPORTANT NOTICE: Once you have paid for a trip, it is very important to let Halinka know if you are unable to go for whatever reason, as we have reserve lists and members may be able to go in your place.

Thursday July 13th - Veolia Recycling Centre, Warren Way, Crown Farm Industrial Park, Forest Town, Mansfield NG19 0FL

Organised by Chris Dean (assisted by John Butler). The closing date for joining this **FREE** trip is **Monday, 10th July**, as advance notice of attendees has to be given to Veolia.

Members have to make their own way there and meet punctually at 10am at the venue:

There is no charge. The visit lasts 2 hours.

Sensible flat, covered footwear or walking boots must be worn by all visitors. Hard hats and high visibility jackets will be provided for the site tour. As this is a working industrial site, all members taking part will be issued with a copy of Veolia's site-specific safety guidance to read prior to the visit.

Following the visit, Chris Dean is organising an informal lunch at the Widecombe Fair Pub & Grill near the Oak Tree crossroads, but needs to know numbers in order to reserve places. If you wish to join those dining, please email her at childad38@gmail.com before Monday 10th July to reserve a place and advise her of your menu choice.

The trip scheduled for the Wednesday July 19th Open Day at Canine Partners, near Loughborough, has been cancelled due to only one member putting their name down.

Wednesday August 2nd - Wakefield National Mining Museum.

One place is available. We depart from the Sherwood Ranger at 9am. Cost for entry and travel is £15. (£10.60 if you do not go underground).

An underground tour of the mine is included in the £15 and this lasts for 1 hour and 20 minutes.

There are various exhibitions and stories relating to the coal mining industry and these are in the museum at ground level.

There is also a cafeteria on site, but if you prefer, you may bring your own packed lunch.

There are now two trips to the Imperial War Museum & The Lowry Galleries in Manchester.

Original Trip - Thursday September 21st - 2 places available.

New Trip - Monday September 18th - 3 places available.

The cost for each trip is £15 per person with free entry to the museum and art galleries. We depart from the Sherwood Ranger at **9am**. We will leave Manchester at approx 3.30pm

Ru3a TRIPS UPDATE FROM HALINKA RAJCHEL - TRIPS CO-ORDINATOR

It is going to be a free day for you to visit the Imperial War Museum and the Lowry Galleries, a short distance from each other. You may choose to go to the IWM first and then go for some lunch at one of the eateries and then return to the IWM or go to the Lowry Galleries. You may choose your own timings and events.

IWM exhibitions include hand crafted ceramic poppies, and a timeline with key events of global conflicts. Suggested timing for IWM is 2 hours but you may prefer a longer time.

The Lowry galleries include works by LS Lowry and other modern artists. Suggested timing for the gallery is 45 minutes.

Opening times: Imperial War Museum (10am to 5pm) and The Lowry Galleries (11am to 5pm)

Departure is at 9am from the Sherwood Ranger for both trips.

The eleven members who put their names down on the reserve list need to pay at the July meeting otherwise their places will be made available to other members.

NEW TRIP

Tuesday October 3rd - Museum of Lincolnshire Life at Lincoln.

The cost is £10, this includes travel and a guided tour and talk in the museum.

This is a great opportunity to meet Daphne, a World War One Tank and see exhibitions and history of Lincolnshire from 1750 to the present day. As the museum is at the top of the road (Burton Road) there are numerous shops and tea rooms without having to go down the hill and back up again.

Lincoln Cathedral is about 10 minutes walk away also at the top of the hill and you may wish to visit the cathedral. There is an entrance fee for this (not included in our trip) but I understand that some parts of the Cathedral are free, e.g. to say a prayer, so you may wish to take up that opportunity.

Departing from The Sherwood Ranger at 9.30am and leaving Lincoln at approx 3pm.

Thursday October 19th - Trent River Cruise and lunch

A two hour river cruise starting from Colwick, Nottingham along the River Trent, which also includes a two course meal. The organised RCT transport to the venue is **FULL**, but you can still join the trip.

The cost of the river cruise and lunch is £19 but you will need to get to Colwick using your own transport.

Thursday November 9th - Newark.

Transport only £6 plus entrance (see below)*

A visit to the Civil War Museum between 10.30am and 12.30, then time for food in nearby eateries before going to the Newark Cemetery for a talk and tour given by a member of the Newark Town Hall.

Admission to the Civil War Museum is £7 for concessions (If you are a member of English Heritage you have 30% off)

If you pay Council Tax to Newark and Sherwood Council you have free entry to the museum (Blidworth belongs to the Newark and Sherwood Council)

Departing from The Sherwood Ranger at 9.30am, leaving Newark at approximately 3pm.



What is it about?

Age UK's Digital Inclusion programme is designed to give service users with no to low-level digital skills the ability and motivation to get online and to improve their digital skills.

The programme will be delivered through Age UK's Digital Champion volunteers, who will deliver one to one and group sessions to the programme's service users. Each service user will have in place a personcentred plan to identify what digital skills they wish to learn and improve on.

INDEPENDENT AGE 'GOOD TO KNOW™' GROUPS



Independent Age, a campaigning charity for the elderly, have advised us about their free telephone information groups that are open to people 65+, particularly suited for those without internet access.

Their 'Good to Know™' telephone groups invite a different guest speaker each week to discuss issues that matter to older people. Topics include scams, the cost-of-living crisis, social care, benefits and finding new social connections - things that are simply 'Good To Know' about.

Since their 'Good to Know™' Groups launched, they've had guest speakers from organisations including StepChange, Mind, Parkinsons UK, and Cruse as well as specialist advisors from Independent Age's benefits and social care teams.

Think of these groups like a cup of tea and a chat at a community centre, but over the phone in the comfort of your living room. The groups are particularly great for older people unable to get out and about, or to online activities, but anyone over the age of 65 is welcome.
