Imperial War Museum & The Lowry Galleries in Manchester

2 trips - Monday September 18th & Thursday September 21st

The cost for each trip is £15 per person with free entry to the museum and art galleries. We depart from the Sherwood Ranger at **9am**. We will leave Manchester at approx 3.30pm

It is going to be a free day for you to visit the Imperial War Museum and the Lowry Galleries, a short distance from each other. You may choose to go to the IWM first and then go for some lunch at one of the eateries and then return to the IWM or go to the Lowry Galleries. IWM exhibitions include hand crafted ceramic poppies, and a timeline with key events of global conflicts. Suggested timing for IWM is 2 hours but you may prefer a longer time.

The Lowry galleries include works by LS Lowry and other modern artists. Suggested timing for the gallery is 45 minutes. There is a cafeteria at the Imperial War Museum and plenty of other eateries very close by.

Tuesday October 3rd - Museum of Lincolnshire Life at Lincoln.

The cost is £10, this includes travel and a guided tour and talk in the museum.

This is a great opportunity to meet Daphne, a World War One Tank and see exhibitions and history of Lincolnshire from 1750 to the present day. As the museum is at the top of the road (Burton Road) there are numerous shops and tea rooms without having to go down the hill and back up again.

Lincoln Cathedral is about 10 minutes walk away also at the top of the hill and you may wish to visit the cathedral. There is an entrance fee for this (not included in our trip) but I understand that some parts of the Cathedral are free, e.g. to say a prayer, so you may wish to take up that opportunity.

Thursday October 19th - Trent River Cruise and lunch

A two hour river cruise starting from Colwick, Nottingham along the River Trent, which also includes a two course meal. The trip is now **FULLY BOOKED.**

A visit to the Civil War Museum between 10.30am and 12.30, then time for food in nearby eateries before going to the Newark Cemetery for a talk and tour given by a member of the Newark Town Hall.

If you pay Council Tax to Newark and Sherwood Council you have free entry to the museum (Blidworth belongs to the Newark and Sherwood Council)

Departing from The Sherwood Ranger at 9.30am, leaving Newark at approximately 3pm.






Ru3a TRIPS UPDATE FROM HALINKA RAJCHEL - TRIPS CO-ORDINATOR

In return we received helmets and flashlights, then down we went, tightly packed.

140ft of dripping walls straight to the coal face.



We saw safety devices, canaries, Davey lamps, gas sensors. None prevented the accidents and loss of life which too often occurred.

A message from Liz Thackray, Chair of the Third Age Trust

At the end of July the Trust launched a new Facebook group:

'Fit for the Future' (click for link)

It has a focus on discussing governance, finance and what kind of organisational structure the Third Age Trust needs to have in order to be 'Fit for the Future'.

THIRD AGE TRUST - FIT FOR THE FUTURE - LIZ THACKRAY

Last year, following the AGM, we introduced some of our thinking about what kind of governance structure we need moving forwards. This was to correct some of the problems with our current arrangements.

A Steering Group has been established comprising the Chair and Vice Chair of the Trust together with five Trustees and our CEO. This group has terms of reference set by the Board and reports to it.

It, in turn, is responsible for overseeing the Pilot Council which is chaired by a regional Trustee and is exploring different models for engaging the u3a membership in discussion with u3a Board members.

The core membership of the Pilot Council comprises regional and national Trustees. In addition there are representatives of Network link and the main Board committees. Each Trustee invites an additional person, not the same person each time, to attend the meetings, so as to enable different perspectives to be expressed. At present the Pilot Council has no official status, but we hope it will become an important part of our governance structure. If there is something you think the Council should be discussing about what u3as do or should be doing, please email your thoughts to council@u3a.org.uk - who knows, you may get invited to join in a pilot council discussion.

It is early days for these developments, but just as our founders created an organisation that made the most of what society was like in the early 1980s, we need to ensure we are relevant and responding to society today

The 40th Annual General Meeting (AGM) of the Third Age Trust will be held as a hybrid meeting allowing u3a delegates to attend in person or online.
