#### IT'S THAT TIME AGAIN - 2024 MEMBERSHIP RENEWALS!

We thank everyone who has already renewed for **2024**, but this is just to remind those of you who haven't re-joined yet that **Membership fees** are due on the **1st January every year**, and renewal **payments MUST be made before 28th February** to retain your ability to participate in our Groups, Trips & Events.

Due to inflationary costs incurred by the u3a we have had to increase the cost of Full membership by £1 to £16 per person for the year, and £12 for Associate Members who can prove they are existing fully paid-up members of another u3a. In this case, please provide the name of the u3a and your membership number with them.

#### **GIFT AID**

As a registered charity we shall continue to take advantage of the Gift Aid scheme in respect of subscriptions from those who are eligible to participate i.e. they are <u>individual</u> taxpayers. Their subscriptions are treated as Charitable Donations on which the u3a is able to reclaim tax at the current rate. Many of you have signed a Declaration to this effect so, provided you still remain eligible to participate, there is nothing you need do and your existing Declaration remains valid.


#### 5.0 SHOWCASED GROUP AT OUR FEBRUARY MEETING

The RCT mini-coach will drop us off for a guided tour of St Mary's Church starting at 10.30am, then take us to Highfields Park for the Gallery visit.

For centuries letters have been key vehicles of human communication. This exhibition explores correspondence from the medieval period to the present and celebrates the letter's enduring importance.

It examines letters' capacity to chronicle all stages and aspects of human life - from birth to death - and to capture both the personal and the professional.

It reveals how they are powerful in their abilities to connect with and impact on the lives of others. It illuminates how letters are also deeply vulnerable, fragile objects whose preservation is liable to the vicissitudes of time, fashion, and chance.

#### The Herbert Art Gallery & Museum, Coventry

1ST TRIP - Thursday 28th March 2024 - TRIP FULL

2ND TRIP - Monday 17th June 2024 - PLACES AVAILABLE

Departing from The Sherwood Ranger at 9am. Cost of travel is £15

The RCT mini-coach will drop us off for a tour of the Herbert Art Gallery & Museum adjacent to both the ruins of the bombed out old Cathedral and the current Coventry Cathedral that was built next to it to a design by Sir Basil Spence.

Ranging from tiny insects to large industrial machinery, from everyday household objects to artworks by world-famous artists the Herbert collection covers a vast array of topics, time and themes including: Archaeology, Social and Industrial History, Visual Arts & Natural History





The Museum is close to the City centre, so there will be plenty of time to explore Coventry and have lunch before returning around 3pm.

#### Flag Fen Bronze Age Settlement & Peterborough City Centre

1ST TRIP - Monday 22nd April 2024 - TRIP FULL

2ND TRIP - Thursday 23rd May 2024 - PLACES AVAILABLE

Departing from The Sherwood Ranger at **9am**. **Cost is £21** including travel & the entrance fee to the Flag Fen Settlement.

The RCT mini-coach will drop us off for a guided tour of the ancient Flag Fen Settlement site and then take us into Peterborough City Centre.

The story of Flag Fen began in 1971 when excavations ahead of the construction of Peterborough New Town revealed an almost intact Bronze Age landscape, which ran along the edge of the drained fen.

There will be time afterwards to explore Peterborough City Centre, have lunch and visit the Peterborough Cathedral (free entry)





#### Kedleston Hall - A National Trust property near Quarndon in Derbyshire

1ST TRIP - Thursday 18th April 2024 - ONE PLACE LEFT

2ND TRIP - Friday 5th July 2024 - PLACES AVAILABLE

Departing from The Sherwood Ranger at **9.30am**. **Cost of travel is £8.** Entrance for National Trust members is free. **Non-NT member Entrance Fee for Hall & Parkland is £18**, Parkland only is £8

Kedleston Hall is an 18th-century mansion with Adam interiors, surrounded by vast parkland.



#### Leicester Cathedral, with an optional visit to the Richard III Visitor Centre

#### Friday 17th May 2024 - PLACES AVAILABLE

Departing from The Sherwood Ranger at **9.30am**.

#### Cost of travel is £10

The RCT mini-coach will drop us off in the City Centre close to the Cathedral where Richard III's bones are interred, and you will have time to visit the Richard III Visitor Centre nearby. Entrance to both locations are free. No guided tour is available on this occasion.



The Normans began the construction of the original St Martin's church of around 900 years ago. It was rebuilt and enlarged between the 13th and 15th centuries and became the 'Civic Church', with strong links with the merchants and guilds (with the Guildhall being located nearby)

Just over 100 years ago the Victorian Architect, Raphael Brandon, magnificently restored and, in places, rebuilt the church, including the addition of a 220ft spire. When the Diocese of Leicester was reestablished in 1927, the church was hallowed as Leicester Cathedral. In 2015 King Richard III was reinterred in the Cathedral. In 2024 the Cathedral reopened after 22 months of redevelopment.

#### Calke Abbey - A National Trust property near Ticknall in Derbyshire

1ST TRIP - Wednesday 12th June 2024 - 4 PLACES LEFT

2ND TRIP - Wednesday 8th May 2024 - PLACES AVAILABLE

Departing from The Sherwood Ranger at 9.30am.

**Cost of travel is £8.** Entrance for National Trust members is free. **Non-NT member Entrance Fee for Hall & Parkland is £12.50**, Parkland only is £7.50

With peeling paintwork and overgrown courtyards, Calke Abbey is an un-stately home and country estate that tells the story of the dramatic decline of a country house estate. The house and stables are little restored, with many abandoned areas vividly portraying a period in the 20th century when numerous country houses did not survive to tell their story.



## Bakewell International Dance Festival Saturday 29th June 2024 - TRIP FULL

Departing from the Sherwood Ranger at 9am. Cost of travel is £7

There are numerous dance shows starting at 11am in various outside venues in the town all within two minutes walking distance from each other.

There is also the farmers market and an opportunity to view a well dressing in Bakewell. An opportunity not to be missed.

The dance shows finish at approx 4pm. If we have rain, the dances will be held in the town hall.

There is so much to see and do in Mablethorpe: from strolling along the golden sands, taking a trip on the famous Sand Train, having fun in the beach side Fun Fair, through to a ride on the Miniature Railway or hiring a boat on the lake at Queens Park.



A little further out of the town centre you can visit the Seal Rescue Sanctuary and Wildlife Centre.

## Tattersall Castle - A National Trust property near Coningsby in Lincolnshire Tuesday 16th July 2024 - PLACES AVAILABLE

Departing from the Sherwood Ranger at 9am.

#### Cost of travel is £11

Entrance for National Trust members is free. **Non-NT member Entrance Fee for Hall & Grounds is £12.50** 

Rising proudly from the flat Lincolnshire fens, Tattershall Castle, with its huge Gothic fireplaces and church-like windows, was designed to impress. Built by Lord Ralph Cromwell, Treasurer of England, it was designed to show off his wealth, position and power.



This trip is during the Festival of Archaeology. An optional walk is available (1.2 km about 45 minute walk). There's plenty to do and see, and there is a cafeteria on site for snacks and hot drinks available by the church. People may choose to bring a packed lunch and top up with snacks from the cafe/shop. (NT members have a discount in the shop).
