Every 2nd and 4th Wednesday of the month at Ravenshead Village Hall from noon to 1pm



This month we visited South America to learn about the deserts on the continent.

First we started with the Atacama Desert which is probably well known to most people with its pink flamingos lunar landscapes, volcanos and geysers, salt flats, ruined temples and colonial villages, all at heights of over 2450m above sea level.

Then we moved on to the Bolivian Uyuni Salt Flats with vast sheets of pentagon shaped plates of salt, stretching as far as the eye could see.



Next we moved on to Lençóis Maranhenses National Park in Brazil.

This is a landscape with rippling sand dunes pitted with freshwater lagoons. The park is just round the corner of Brazil's shoulder on the North East, once wealthy with vast sugar plantations, and has a cultural identity all of its own, complemented by wonderful beaches.

The next part of our journey took us to the Peruvian Coastal Desert Nazca Lines. These "structures' will be well known to people who watch National Geographic or Discovery channels. Here you can see the giant geoglyphs depicting animals of all shapes and sizes.

Finally we went a little further north into Mexico to see the beauty of the Chihuahuan desert, with its bleak Desert crust and the fantastic Copper Canyon. You can visit this on a train.

The Herbert Art Gallery & Museum, Coventry

The RCT mini-coach will drop us off for a tour of the Herbert Art Gallery & Museum adjacent to both the ruins of the bombed out old Cathedral and the current Coventry Cathedral that was built next to it to a design by Sir Basil Spence.

Ranging from tiny insects to large industrial machinery, from everyday household objects to artworks by world-famous artists the Herbert collection covers a vast array of topics, time and themes including: Archaeology, Social and Industrial History, Visual Arts & Natural History





The Museum is close to the City centre, so there will be plenty of time to explore Coventry and have lunch before returning around 3pm.

Flag Fen Bronze Age Settlement & Peterborough City Centre

1ST TRIP - Monday 22nd April 2024 - TRIP FULL

2ND TRIP - Thursday 23rd May 2024 - 7 PLACES AVAILABLE

Departing from The Sherwood Ranger at **9am**. **Cost is £21** including travel & the entrance fee to the Flag Fen Settlement.

The RCT mini-coach will drop us off for a guided tour of the ancient Flag Fen Settlement site and then take us into Peterborough City Centre.

The story of Flag Fen began in 1971 when excavations ahead of the construction of Peterborough New Town revealed an almost intact Bronze Age landscape, which ran along the edge of the drained fen.

There will be time afterwards to explore Peterborough City Centre, have lunch and visit the Peterborough Cathedral (free entry)

Kedleston Hall is an 18th-century mansion with Adam interiors, surrounded by vast parkland.



Leicester Cathedral, with an optional visit to the Richard III Visitor Centre

Friday 17th May 2024 - 5 PLACES AVAILABLE

Departing from The Sherwood Ranger at **9.30am**.

Cost of travel is £10

The RCT mini-coach will drop us off in the City Centre close to the Cathedral where Richard III's bones are interred, and you will have time to visit the Richard III Visitor Centre nearby. **Entrance to the Visitor**Centre is £9 for those 60+. No group tour is available on this occasion.



The Normans began the construction of the original St Martin's church of around 900 years ago. It was rebuilt and enlarged between the 13th and 15th centuries and became the 'Civic Church', with strong links with the merchants and guilds (with the Guildhall being located nearby)

Just over 100 years ago the Victorian Architect, Raphael Brandon, magnificently restored and, in places, rebuilt the church, including the addition of a 220ft spire. When the Diocese of Leicester was reestablished in 1927, the church was hallowed as Leicester Cathedral. In 2015 King Richard III was reinterred in the Cathedral. In 2024 the Cathedral reopened after 22 months of redevelopment.

Calke Abbey - A National Trust property near Ticknall in Derbyshire

With peeling paintwork and overgrown courtyards, Calke Abbey is an un-stately home and country estate that tells the story of the dramatic decline of a country house estate. The house and stables are little restored, with many abandoned areas vividly portraying a period in the 20th century when numerous country houses did not survive to tell their story.



THIRD AGE TRUST - 'FIT FOR THE FUTURE' PROPOSED u3a GOVERNANCE STRUCTURE CHANGES

The u3a movement in the UK is rare amongst charity organisations in that we don't have a 'Top Down' structure with a Head Office and local branches.

In England we are locally independent u3a charities, with our own governance and differing constitutions, and are 'affiliated' to the national Third Age Trust based in London, which is an 'umbrella' charity that offers support to the over 1,000 local u3as in the country.

In addition we have an active u3a Network at a county level (Nottinghamshire Network) and national representation through a Regional (East Midlands) level. Our Regional Trustee is elected, with John Lewis (previously Chair of Bingham u3a) being our current Regional Trustee.

Since early 2022, the Third Age Trust Board has been considering changes that would give u3as more of a voice and would let them spend more time on issues that directly affect u3as and networks. As there is now much more regulation around charities, they also want to make sure that their Board can deal with such matters more effectively.

Their proposed new structure consists of a smaller Board, focused on governance and finance, and a new "u3a Council" where elected representatives highlight and resolve issues that u3as want to be addressed.

For the past few months, the Trust have been running a Pilot Council to try out how this may work in practice. Also over the past months, there have also been various opportunities for some u3as to comment on these plans, but they now want to ensure all u3as have an opportunity to contribute to the discussion. They want to hear the comments, thoughts and ideas from u3as and their members before taking the proposals any further.

More information was shared with u3a committees on 22nd January about this consultation, which is taking place from now until the end of April 2024, and you can read this email by clicking **HERE**.

A decision will be made in June about the final proposals and a vote will be tabled for all individual u3as to accept or reject at the 2024 Third Age Trust AGM in October.

In late January, the Nottinghamshire Network of u3a's held a Hybrid Zoom meeting at the Centre at St Peter's for representatives of u3as in the East Midland Region, facilitated by Ravenshead u3a's Tech Team.
