### **GROUP PROFILE**

#### **CRIBBAGE GROUP**

Rayleigh U3A Cribbage Group was formed in the first quarter of 2010 after I attended a similar U3A Crib Club in Spain.

I am a Chemist and spent all my working life in the pharmaceutical industry, first as a Research Chemist and ending as a worldwide production manager working and living in Pakistan and Nigeria. I was lucky to retire early aged 53 and needed something to fill my time. A year after retiring I was sworn in as an Essex Magistrate based at the Southend Court.
