CHURCH GROUP 1 visit to Wesleyan Methodist Chapel at Leigh



Wesleyan Methodist Chapel, also known as The Fishermen's Chapel, is in New Road, Leigh-on-Sea.

Preacher John Wesley travelled to Leigh in 1748 on his horse to find where the fishing fleet were based. He preached in the street and visited many times in the following years and preached in houses.

Eventually the first Wesleyan Chapel was built.

Many Fishermen families have attended the Chapel - names are repeated on memorials of those that lost their lives in WW1 and WW2. There is a stained-glass window depicting the fishermen of Leigh.

The Chapel is used by the Community in many ways and is well worth a visit. We were given an interesting and illustrated talk by a Church Member.






